TODAY'S READINGS

You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.
(Mark 1:11)
"He wants to be the bride at every wedding the

He wants to be the bride at every wedding, the corpse at every funeral, and the baby at every christening." Ironically, the subject of this cynical remark was a world leader. Even though he often commanded center stage, he still craved attention. Deep down, most people do. To varying degrees, we're like those little kids who want someone to notice and affirm us: "Watch me jump! Look at this trick! See what I can do!"

Today's celebration conveys a message about this human craving. In fact, you might call the Baptism of the Lord the "Feast of Full Attention." The spotlight is on Jesus, who comes to John as just another penitent in the crowd. Then suddenly, he is singled out as uniquely cherished: the heavens are torn apart, the Spirit descends, and the Father's voice declares him "my beloved Son." What a stunning affirmation of Jesus' importance!

But here's something just as stunning: the Sacrament of Baptism brings us right into Jesus' own relationship with the Father! You don't have to strive for attention, wonder who you are, or question whether your life matters. If you've been baptized into Christ, what the Father spoke to Jesus, he speaks to you: "You are my beloved son. You are my beloved daughter." Yes, you need to be transformed into the likeness of Christ. And yes, that takes time. But as you make that journey, you can rest secure that you are already God's beloved child. Everything flows from that.

Today, as the Christmas season comes to a close, why not give one last gift? Offer God your full attention, as you reflect on your baptism. Let him reveal you to yourself and show you how greatly you are loved. As you give God your full attention, you will discover how much you have his.



veces se dice que Juan Bautista fue el precursor del Mesías; el mensajero de Dios para traer la buena noticia al pueblo escogido acerca del Hijo de Dios que estaba entre ellos.

Juan dijo claramente que él no era sino la voz que gritaba en el desierto para exhortar al pueblo a preparar el camino para el que venía atrás de él, que era más importante que él. El Bautista no se anduvo con rodeos al proclamar que detrás venía uno más grande que él. Quería dejar en claro que la gente no debía fijarse en él y buscar al que era más eminente y digno: "No merezco ni siquiera inclinarme para desatarle la correa de su sandalias". No cabe duda alguna de que Juan se consideraba servidor. Tanto Jesús como Juan se consideraron servidores de Dios, con la misión de servir al pueblo escogido.

Cuando Jesús les lavó los pies a los discípulos (labor de los esclavos bajos), dijo a los doce que ellos debían ir y hacer lo mismo (Juan 13,12-16). En otras palabras, seguir su ejemplo de servicio. En otra ocasión, les explicó que el lugar que cada uno tendrá en el Reino dependerá de cómo y cuánto cada uno hubiera servido a los demás (Marcos 10,41-45).

San Juan Bautista reconoció y aceptó la grandeza de Jesús, y nosotros haríamos bien en imitarlo en este sentido. No que sea inapropiado pensar que Jesús es nuestro hermano y amigo, pero no debemos dejar de reconocer su dignidad la gloriosa majestad que le corresponde como Dios Hijo, Segunda persona de la Santísima Trinidad. Él nos une a sí mismo, por medio del espíritu Santo que recibimos en el Bautismo, para ser hermanos suyos e hijos del Padre. Él es quien nos brinda la vida y el poder de Dios al bautizarnos con el Espíritu Santo (Marcos 1,8).

New Year's Day 2015

(Msgr. Jameson's homily, prepared but not delivered)

New Year's Day of the year 2015! A day of new beginnings, a day of new hope. For no matter how jaded we may have become about our lives or our world, there is, happily, a day like today to renew us in hope. The day we stopped celebrating New Year's Day or stopped making New Year's resolutions would be a sad day, I think. It would say something about the dying of hope.

So, go ahead with those resolutions – even if you've tried them before and abandoned them early. Go on that long-dreaded diet, get back to the gym; cut back on TV and do more reading, keep a tighter rein on your credit cards. Or make up your mind to stay in better touch with family members and friends. Or dig even deeper and promise to let go this year of a long-festering grudge – replacing the cold of resentment with the warmth of forgiveness.

And I have the perfect resolution for all of you who are St. Matthew's Cathedral parishioners. Since we have just begun our 175th Anniversary Year, why not resolve to make this the year for cultivating and deepening your relationship with God? We have been working on a menu of possibilities for prayer and spiritual renewal, so this should make your resolution fairly easy to realize.

And isn't it wonderful that we get to begin this year in the company of Mary, the Mother of God and our mother? What better company cold we possibly have? In today's gospel, we saw Mary in a wonderfully reflective moment. Luke tells us that she "treasured" all the things that had happened: the birth of her son, the song of the angels, the visit of the shepherds. She treasured them and she "reflected on them in her heart." For this reason, I would suggest that Mary is the one more than any other who should be our companion during this Anniversary Year. She can show us how to treasure all that God has done – and continues to do – in our lives and our parish. She can show us how to reach quietly into our hearts and there to meet the God who is always with us – even when we're not particularly with him.


Dear friends, the Church calls Mary the Mother of God, but she is also Mother of the Church, Mother of saints, Mother of sinners, Mother of us all. The Church wants us to realize that our own vocation — the call each of us received on the day of our baptism — is to do what Mary did: to bring Jesus Christ into our world. To give birth to Jesus in our time and in all places where we live our lives. Now there's an agenda for our Anniversary Year, wouldn't you agree? Mary's motherhood of Jesus was, of course, unique but her "yes" to God is something we can all do. Along with Mary, we can make Christ come to life in ways he never otherwise could or would — were it not for us.


Can we agree on a parish New Year's resolution, then? A resolution for our 175th Anniversary Year? I propose we resolve to do what Mary did: to bring Jesus Christ to birth in our lives – his values, his Gospel, his way of looking at life and at people, his mercy, his forgiveness, his love. 
