

TODAY'S READINGS

Because he clings to me, I will deliver him. (*Psalm 91:14*)

Do you remember falling in love? The whole world seemed new, and you felt as if you were walking on air—all because someone had stolen your heart.

As exhilarating as that feeling is, it's just the beginning of a love story. As your relationship progresses, you learn that love isn't just a warm feeling. It also involves responsibility and hard work. In every relationship, situations come up in which you have to choose to protect and develop your love—and that often means a degree of self-sacrifice. It may mean turning down a promotion because it would take away more time with your family than would be healthy. It may mean caring for an aging parent or spouse who has become dependent on you for everything. It's in times like these that you are called to embrace a fuller meaning of love: selflessness.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus enters the desert, where he is tempted by Satan. While each temptation is different, they all have the same goal of luring Jesus away from his commitment to love us "to the end" (*John 13:1*). Jesus chooses love.

This is a fitting topic for the feast day of St. Valentine. In the third century, the emperor Claudius II banned all marriages in Rome so that he could have more unattached men for his army. Valentine, a bishop, defied the emperor's order and married couples in secret. He was ultimately arrested, beaten, and beheaded. Valentine could have chosen self-preservation, but he sacrificed his life for love instead.

Today, consider the way that Jesus and many heroes of the faith have chosen love over personal gain or preservation. Think about the way their decisions have caused a ripple effect on the world. Then ask the Lord to show you how you can take the next step toward choosing love.

"Lord, help me remember to make my relationships a priority. Teach me how to love as you did, Jesus—fully and from the heart."

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY



First Sunday of Lent – Forgiving offenses is a wonderful Spiritual Work of Mercy to practice during Lent. As Jesus Christ instructs us in the Sermon on the Mount, "If you forgive others their transgressions, your heavenly Father will forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, neither will your

Father forgive your transgressions" (*Matt. 6:14-15*). These words immediately follow the "Our Father", stressing how important forgiveness is in following the will of God. Today and in the week to come, how can you share God's forgiveness and mercy with those around you, just as Christ instructs us? *Receive forgiveness yourself, that you may share it with others. Find more at www.mercy.adw.org.*

Did you know? St. Matthew's Cathedral is one of pilgrimage site to receive the plenary (total) indulgence for this Holy Year of Mercy! How can one do this? Here is some guidance:

1. Enter the Cathedral by the **Holy Door of Mercy** – near the Baptistry.
2. Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Penance) within 20 days before or after entering the Holy Door.
3. Participate in Mass and receive Holy Eucharist within 20 days before or after entering the Holy Door.
4. Pray for the Intentions of Pope Francis (we do this at every Mass).
5. Make a Profession of Faith by praying the Apostles Creed (prayed at every Rosary) or Nicene Creed (prayed every Sunday Mass and Holy Day).
6. You can also offer this indulgence for someone who has died.

LIVING LENT

Lenten Fast and Abstinence – Ash Wednesday (**February 10**) and Good Friday (**March 25**) are days of fast and abstinence. All Catholics who have reached their 18th birthday and are less than 60 years of age are bound to observe the fast, by which they are limited to a single full meal during the course of the day. All Catholics who have reached their 14th birthday must observe days of abstinence, during which no meat may be eaten. Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl Program – Join our parish community and nearly 14,000 Catholic communities across the United States in a life-changing Lenten journey with CRS Rice Bowl. Pick up your family's rice bowl after any Mass next weekend, **February 13-14** and download the CRS Rice Bowl app! Remember, what you give up for Lent changes lives.

Stations of the Cross – The Via Crucis is a journey made in the Holy Spirit, that divine fire that burned in the heart of Jesus (cf Lk 1:49-50) and brought him to Calvary. The Stations of the Cross in the form adopted by Pope John Paul II will be prayed in English on Fridays of Lent at 6pm, followed by a Simple Lenten Meal, and in Spanish on Sundays of Lent at 2:15pm. Join us for this beautiful devotion, so fitting for Lent.

Wednesday Evening Confessions – This Lent all parishes in the Archdiocese of Washington and the Diocese of Arlington will offer confessions every Wednesday from 6:30 to 8pm. Confessions at St. Matthew's in English and Spanish will be heard from 6:30 to 8pm each Wednesday of Lent beginning **February 17**, in addition to our regular confession times (weekdays, 11am-Noon, Saturdays, 4-5pm, after the 1pm Spanish Mass on Sundays of Lent except March 6).

Midday Lenten Prayer with the Community of Sant'Egidio – The Community of Sant'Egidio in Washington, DC invites you to share their common prayer every Tuesday during Lent at 12:45pm in Saint Anthony's Chapel. "Prayer is never in vain; it rises ceaselessly to the Lord so that anguish is turned into hope, tears into joy, despair into happiness, and solitude into communion."

LECTURAS DE HOY

Dios pidió a los israelitas que le ofrecieran los primeros frutos de la tierra que les daba, como muestra de su fe. De este modo, el diezmo del pueblo era la respuesta al deseo de Dios de liberarlos. Jesús es el Mesías prometido que nos lleva a Dios.

Hoy se celebra el Día del Amor y es una ocasión propicia para que todos nos detengamos un momento para hacer una oración especial por nuestros seres amados, particularmente por nuestra esposa o marido, hijos y tal vez nietos, pidiendo que el Señor les bendiga de un modo especial, nada más por el hecho de ser ellos objetos de nuestro amor. También no nos olvidemos de saludarlos personalmente y expresarles nuestro cariño de la mejor manera posible. ¡El Señor estará contento si lo hacemos!


