TODAY'S READINGS

hey were all filled with the Holy Spirit. (Acts 2:4) At his son's twenty-first birthday party, the proud father began a toast by recalling the day his boy was born. "What a wonderful day it was!" he said. "Your mother and I are so glad you came into our lives—although we don't care too much for what you have done since then!" He was joking, of course, and his son knew it. He knew his father loved him and treasured every day they had spent together.

We're celebrating a birthday today as well: the day the Church was born. But as that father's joke showed, there's more to a birthday than remembering the day it all began. So today, let's thank the Holy Spirit for "what he has done since then"!

Think about it: without the Spirit's inspiration, Christian men and women would not have handed down the gospel message from generation to generation until it reached you.

But the Holy Spirit doesn't just live in our great saints, whether past or present. He is also in you, helping you live a holy life. Have you ever felt inspired to reach out to someone in need? That's the Holy Spirit. Have you ever tried to share your faith with someone? That's the Holy Spirit. Have you ever fought hard against temptation and won? That's the Spirit. Have you ever left Mass or come out of a prayer time feeling refreshed and closer to God? That, too, is the Holy Spirit!

So thank him! Think of some small way you can celebrate what he has done and what he is still doing today. Maybe look online to see the different ways Pentecost is marked across the world. Maybe spend a few extra minutes in prayer reading about the gifts of the Spirit. Or maybe treat yourself and your loved ones to a special dessert. After all, it is a birthday!



LECTURAS DE HOY

Palabras del Papa Francisco en 2013 sobre Pentecostés: "En este día, contemplamos y recivimos en la liturgia la efusión del espíritu santo que Cristo resucitado derramó sobre la Iglesia.

"Pero, ¿Qué sucedió en aquel día tan lejano a nosotros, y sin embargo, tan cercano, que llega hasta dentro de nuestro corazón? San lucas nos lleva hasta Jerusalén, al piso superior donde están reunidos los apóstoles. El primer elemento que nos llama la atención es el estruendo que de repente vino del cielo, 'y lleno toda la casa; luego, las 'leguascomo llamaradas' que se dividían y se postraban encima de cada uno de los apóstoles.

"Estruendo y leguas de fuefo son signos claros y concretos que tocan a los apóstoles, no sólo exteriormente, sino también en su interio: en su mente y en su corazón. Como consecuencia. 'se llenaron todos del Espíritu Santo', que descadenó su fuerza irresistible, con resultados lamativos: "Empezaron a hablar en otras lenguas, según les concedía manifestarse.' Asistimos, entonces, a una situación totalmente sorprendente: una multitud se congrega y queda almirada porque cada uno oye hablar a los apóstoles en su propia lengua: 'Los oímos hablar en nuestra lengua nativa.' ¿Y de qué hablan? 'de las grandezas de Dios.'

"A la luz de este texto de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, deseo replexionar sobre una palabra relacionada con la acción del Espíritu: novedad. La novedad nos da siempre un poco de miedo, porque nos sentimos mós seguros si tenemos todo bajo control. Con frecuencia seguimos al Señor, lo acogemos, pero hasta un cierto punto, porque nos resulta difícil abandonarnos a él con total confianza. Tenemos miedo a que Dios nos lleve por caminos nuevos, nos saque de nuestros horizontes con frecuencia limitados, cerrados, egoístas, para abrirnos a los suyos. Pero, en toda la historia de la salvación, cuando Dios ofrece novedad—y pide confianza total en él."

In speaking about the joy of the Gospel in his homily for the Chrism Mass during Holy Week, Pope Francis said,

Like Jesus, the priest makes the message joyful with his entire person. When he preaches...he does so with the joy that touches people's hearts with the same word with which the Lord has touched his own heart in prayer. Like every other missionary disciple, the priest makes the message joyful by his whole being. For as we all know, it is in the little things that joy is best seen and shared: when by taking one small step, we make God's mercy overflow in situations of desolation; when we decide to pick up the phone and arrange to see someone; when we patiently allow others to take up our time.



arrange to see someone; when we patiently allow others to take up our time.

As I prepare for my ordination, the Holy Father's words resonate deeply with me, for it is the joy I have found in knowing Jesus that I want to share with others as a priest. To celebrate the sacraments, particularly the Holy Eucharist, the very source and summit of our Christian lives, Penance, and the Anointing of the Sick, to open up the Scriptures through preaching, to teach our faith in all its breadth and richness, to simply sit with and listen to those who need to talk and offer counsel when I can, to walk with others as we journey together into a deeper relationship with Jesus—the priest serves the Church in these and so many other ways. It is extraordinary to me that the Lord has invited me to give my life to Him in this way!

And part of what is extraordinary is realizing the Lord's patience with me throughout every twist and turn of my life! The Church has been an integral part of life from my childhood. I am so grateful for having grown up with faith and in a family that committed to serving others because of our faith. The Lord planted the idea of the priesthood in me as a teenager, but it took many years to discern intentionally whether this was His desire for me. Yet, through college, my time in the Jesuit Volunteer Corps, and my years in law school and graduate school in public policy, the Lord gave me a deep desire to understand the societal conditions we face together and to live a life of service for others. Through coming to know where He has been present throughout my life and learning to listen to Him speak to my heart, I have come to understand that He has called me to a life of self-emptying service through the ministerial priesthood, to stand in persona Christi so that I can help the faithful share in Christ's own three-fold priestly, prophetic, and kingly ministry.

The past six years in the seminary have been ones of extraordinary grace. Through coming to know better the Lord Jesus, He has given me a deep sense of joy that I want all people to know—a joy rooted in God's infinite and merciful love. This joy gives us hope that no matter what we experience in life, God is always reaching out to us, calling us home, inviting us into His loving embrace.

During my time in Washington, I have been blest to call St. Matthew's Cathedral my parish home. The Cathedral has afforded me so many opportunities to deepen my faith, and I will always be grateful for the parish's warmth and openness. I especially thank Msgr. Jameson, all the priests, and Cathedral staff for their kindness to me—they are a remarkable team of people whose love for the Church and St. Matthew's is a great blessing! And I thank you, the parishioners of St. Matthew's, for your prayers and encouragement, and for walking with me on this journey to ordination! Please continue to pray for the four of us seminarians who will be ordained on Saturday, **June 17** at 10am at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception (and please feel welcome to attend ordination!). 

Faith Direct is a secure system that works directly with your bank or credit card—much the same as other direct payments you may have set up for utility bills or mortgage payments.

When do transactions take place?



Transactions take place once per month on the 4th or the next business day. The total amount of your gifts for that current month (both offertory & second/special collections) will be debited in one monthly total. The Cathedral will receive the funds 4 business days later.
