TODAY'S READINGS

This is my body (Mark 14:22)
Wouldn't it be great if you could just pick up the phone and call God and ask him anything you want? Not to ask him to give you gifts, but to ask him for answers to the mysteries of life. Maybe you could ask why there is suffering in the world. Maybe you would ask something silly, like why there are fleas or whether the chicken or the egg came first. Or maybe you would want to know the secret to a peaceful life. Wouldn't you love to ask God?

Well, you can—but not with a phone call! Today, we celebrate the fact that Jesus has made himself—body, blood, soul, and divinity—available to us in the form of bread and wine. In the Eucharist, he is always with us, "until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). No matter where we go, he is with us: in towering cathedrals or run-

down prisons, in ornate golden chalices and in the palms of sinners' hands.

From the time of the Last Supper until today, Jesus "disdains no dwelling, but consents to come like a guest to any heart, even one that is defiled" (St. Thomas Aquinas). He comes to transform us just as the Host is transformed; not in outward appearance but in our inner lives.

No, you can't call God on the phone, but you can visit him in person. Just to sit in Jesus' presence with a quieted heart can do wonders. There, in the still of adoration, he may give you a sense of peace or whisper a new thought, insight, or idea to you heart.

Will you go to him? Even if you can spend only five minutes, it's worth it. That's five minutes with your King! So go; he is waiting just for you.

"We adore you, Lord Jesus Christ, here and in all your churches throughout the world, and we bless you, for by your holy cross you have redeemed the world." (St. Francis of Assisi)

El pueblo había aceptado a Yahvé como su Dios y la alianza entre ambos quedó sellada con sangre. Así, Dios y su pueblo quedaron unidos con un lazo de vida.

De un modo similar—pero mucho más eficaz—Jesús estableció la Nueva Alianza ofreciendo su propia sangre como sacrificio expiatorio por nuestros pecados (Hebreos 9, 11-15). La sangre de toros y carneros ya no era suficiente. Sólo la sangre vivificante del eterno Hijo de Dios hecho carne pudo restaurar la relación que durante siglos Dios había deseado establecer con su pueblo.

Esta es la maravilla del don del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesús en la Sagrada Eucaristía. Ya no simplemente nos comprometemos a vivir según la ley de Dios, sino que recibimos al Señor mismo, cuando comemos su Cuerpo y bebemos su Sangre. Esta es la alianza que Dios había deseado desde antiguo establecer con su pueblo. Ahora, gracias a Cristo, que entregó su Cuerpo y su Sangre, todos los creyentes podemos entrar en una relación íntima y eterna con Dios expresada en la Nueva Alianza.

IUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY



Celebrate "the living face of the Father's mercy," and the "Mother of Mercy!" -Friday, June

12 is the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, followed by the memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Virgin Mary on Saturday, **June 13**. During this month of June in which we honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus, from which God's mercy flows, Pope Francis' prayer for the **Jubilee Year** of Mercy, below, is especially appropriate. In his Jubilee announcement in March 2015. Pope Francis calls Jesus Christ "the living face of the Father's mercy." In his Iubilee Prayer, Mary is invoked as "Mother of Mercy."

Announcement of the Jubilee

Year -"I have decided to announce an Extraordinary Jubilee which has at its centre the mercy of God. It will be a Holy Year of Mercy. We want to live in the light of the word of the Lord: 'Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful' (cf. Lk 6:36). And this especially applies to confessors! So much mercy!

This Holy Year will commence on the next Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception [December 8, 2015] and will conclude on Sunday, 20 November 2016, the Solemnity of

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe and living face of the Father's mercy." (Pope Francis, March 13, 2015)

Prayer of Pope Francis for Jubilee Year of Mercy -

Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him. Show us your face and we will be saved.

Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and *Magdalene from seeking happiness* only in created things; made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured Paradise to the repentant thief. Let us hear, as if addressed to each one of us, the words that you spoke to the Samaritan woman: "If you knew the gift of God!"

You are the visible face of the invisible Father, of the God who manifests his power above all by forgiveness and mercy: let the Church be your visible face in the world, its Lord risen and glorified.

You willed that your ministers would also be clothed in weakness in order that they may feel compassion for those in ignorance and error: *let everyone who approaches them* feel sought after, loved, and forgiven by God.

Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind.

We ask this through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy, you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. Amen.






