

Today's Readings

We are not discouraged. (*2 Corinthians 4:16*) If anybody had a right to be discouraged, it was St. Paul. During the course of his ministry, he was beaten, shipwrecked, betrayed, slandered, and imprisoned. Today's second reading gives us some insight into the way Paul handled all of this. Mind you, Paul was a tough guy by nature, but we can't think that he was impervious to the stress and strain of the life he had chosen. The key is that he didn't let discouragement overtake him and rule his life.

Discouragement can make us feel hopeless. It can drain us of all energy and prevent us from keeping up with our everyday tasks. If not dealt with, it is also contagious. It can spread through your whole house. So let's look at one way we can deal with discouragement.

At the Last Supper, Jesus told his disciples, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me" (*John 14:1*). Here he was about to face the cross, and yet he spent his last hours on earth helping his friends—by urging them to trust in God. As comforting as these words sound, they also contain a vital strategy: *Hold on to your faith! Trust that my Father and I won't abandon you.*

Whenever we face times of discouragement, we can picture Jesus saying to us, "Don't let your heart be troubled. It's true that *in the world you will have trouble*, but never doubt that *I have conquered the world*" (see *John 16:33*).

St. Paul, echoing Jesus, assures us that nothing can separate us from God's love (*Roman 8:38-39*). It's the knowledge of this truth that kept him from giving in to discouragement. This same motto can help us too.

So the next time you start feeling discouraged, think like Paul. Keep telling yourself that God knows the situation. He feels your pain. He is with you. Never forget that nothing can separate you from his love.

"Jesus, help me to hold fast to your promises."

Music

Great Organ Completion Work

Begins – 23 years ago the first phase of the installation of the Great Organ of the Cathedral was begun. Although it is visually impressive and appears complete, only 2/3 of the pipes were installed at that time. Even in its incomplete state, it was hailed as one of the most impressive pipe organs in the region and is perfectly enhanced by the acoustics of our Cathedral.

Six years ago, we began a campaign to complete the organ. After three years, the campaign had met its goals and a contract was signed. We are very fortunate to have been able to engage the original builder, Lively-Fulcher Organbuilders, to complete the instrument.

This week an interim organ console (a digital electronic organ with speakers) will appear near the organ, allowing us to continue to accompany our liturgies and events until the Great Organ is completed later this year. By **July 1**, dismantling of the current organ will begin, and new chests and pipes will be installed during the summer. At times you will see scaffolding and some façade pipes missing. When the organ is complete this fall or early winter, you will notice dozens of sounds that you have never heard before. It will be as if whole sections of an orchestra that have been silent are now playing!

None of this would have been possible without the generous support of hundreds of parishioners and friends who have embraced the vision of a completed instrument and sacrificed to make it possible.

Parents should contact us at least six (6) months in advance of a desired baptismal date, and may ask for the priest or deacon of their choice to perform the Baptism. Early contact allows parents to be scheduled for the necessary sacramental formation session and godparents to obtain letters from their pastor. Lecturas de Hoy

Todos anhelamos experimentar el toque sanador de Dios. El momento en que nuestros primeros padres desobedecieron al Creador y cayeron de la gracia quedó estampado en la memoria de cada generación, y por eso todos clamamos: "¿Quién nos salvará?"

Cuando los escribas y los fariseos observaban a Jesús sanar y liberar a las multitudes, se llenaban de cólera. Posiblemente pensaban que este obrador de milagros hacía peligrar su prestigio. Por eso, movidos por la envidia, trataron de desacreditar a Jesús, acusándolo de que expulsaba a los demonios por el poder de Satanás. Jesús les respondió con una parábola: "¿Cómo puede Satanás echar a Satanás? Si un Reino está dividido contra sí mismo, tal Reino no puede seguir en pie" (Marcos 3, 22-25). El diablo es el enemigo declarado de Dios y lo único que quiere destruir lo que Dios construye y de hecho lograr la perdición de los humanos. Por eso, Cristo estaba "deshaciendo" las obras del maligno.

En el Génesis leemos que Dios promete que la serpiente sería derrotada por la descendencia de la mujer (Génesis 3, 15). Este primer anuncio de salvación, el "Protoevangelio", prometía que aunque la lucha entre el bien y el mal sería encarnizada, el Maligno sería últimamente derrotado por Jesucristo, verdadero Dios y verdadero Hombre, el cumplimiento de esta promesa. Por su cruz, Cristo despojó al Maligno del derecho que tenía de acosarnos y privarnos de nuestra dignidad de hijo de Dios.

¿Cómo podemos nosotros experimentar el fruto de esta victoria? Por la fe. En momentos de tentación y duda, podemos orar con el salmista: "Con toda mi alma espero al Señor, y confío en su palabra" (Salmo 130(129), 5). Humildemente podemos confesar nuestras debilidades y pedirle al Espíritu del Señor que nos haga fuertes y a medida que aprendamos a esperar en el Señor, iremos experimentando también la sanación y la libertad.

"Señor Jesús, enséñanos a confiar más decididamente en tu victoria sobre el mal y danos fuerzas para vivir para ti, esperando ver la victoria que nos has prometido."




