Today's Readings

ithout parables he did not speak to them. (Mark 4:34)
Did you know that you are quirky? It's true. The fact that you are taking time out to read these words—and, most likely, to read the Scriptures from today's Mass—sets you apart as unusual. Not too many people set aside time for prayer, after all.

But your quirkiness doesn't end there. Do you go to Mass on Sundays? How odd! You could be sleeping in, like a lot of other people. Or getting up early to go fishing. Or any number of other things. Even if you went to Mass yesterday, that's a peculiar way to spend a night off. There are restaurants to visit, movies to see, and TV shows to watch. But there you go, gathering with a bunch of other quirky people to sing to God and eat his Body and drink his Blood.

It gets worse. Do you forgive people from the heart—or at least try to? Do you try to see God in the people around you? How about going into a small booth and telling a man all of your sins? Who does those things?

Of course, you're not really quirky. You're only doing what God created you to do: love him and love your neighbor. But to many people, you are a mystery. And that's exactly how Jesus wants it.

St. Mark tells us that Jesus himself spoke in riddles and parables to the people around him—he even mystified his closest disciples! This was part of his strategy: to provoke his listeners to think more deeply about God and about their lives. He wanted to awaken in them a hunger for God so that they would come ask him for more. Then, when they were ready, he could open their hearts to the "mystery of the kingdom of God" (Mark 4:11).

So keep being quirky! Love. Forgive. Pray. Give. Then, when someone asks why you are the way you are, tell them you're just trying to be like Jesus. Who knows? You may win them over.

Great Organ to be Completed

Soon – Twenty-three years ago, the first phase of the installation of the Great Organ of the Cathedral was begun. Although it is visually impressive and appears complete, only 2/3 of the pipes were installed at that time. Even in its incomplete state, it was hailed as one of the most impressive pipe organs in the region and is perfectly enhanced by the acoustics of our Cathedral.

Six years ago, we began a campaign to complete the organ. Within three years we met our goal. We were very fortunate to engage the original builder, Lively-Fulcher Organbuilders, to complete the instrument.

Last week an interim organ console (a digital electronic organ with speakers) was installed near the organ, allowing us to continue to accompany our liturgies and events until the Great Organ is completed later this year. By **June 25**, a partial dismantling of the current organ will begin, and new chests and pipes will be installed during the summer. At times you will see scaffolding and some façade pipes missing. When the organ is complete this fall or early winter. you will notice dozens of sounds that you have never heard before. It will be as if whole sections of an orchestra that have been silent are now playing!

None of this would have been possible without the generous support of hundreds of parishioners and friends who have embraced the vision of a completed instrument and sacrificed to make it possible.





a semilla germina y crece (Marcos 4, 27) Cuando nos enteramos de cuántos problemas plagan la vida, a veces nos preguntamos si Dios sigue controlando lo que sucede en el mundo. Estas dudas quedan disipadas cuando leemos la parábola de la semilla de mostaza, en la cual Jesús dice que la semilla brota aunque el labrador esté durmiendo. El Reino de Dios está escondido en el mundo, pero el Altísimo lo hace crecer de un modo misterioso e invisible.

El labrador confía que después de preparar el terreno y sembrar, la semilla produzca una cosecha "sin que él sepa cómo". Se limita a hacer su parte y espera que la naturaleza haga el resto. Del mismo modo, podemos confiar que el Reino de Dios está creciendo en nuestro medio. Hacemos lo que podemos para prepararnos para él (Marcos 4, 14-19) y con el tiempo, Dios lo hará fructificar.
