# **Readings for August 26**

Master, to whom shall we go? (John 6:68) Preparing the Israelites to recommit themselves to their covenant with God, Joshua recounted the many ways God had delivered them from their enemies. He reminded them that God had chosen them to be his people and given them the Promised Land as their inheritance. In return, God asked them to honor and serve him alone (Joshua 24:1-15).

Today at Mass, we will have yet another opportunity to recommit ourselves to our new covenant in Christ. Our enemies may not be the sword or spear of other nations. But like our ancestors in the faith, we face battles against fear, pride, ignorance, and complacency. We may not have to conquer a piece of land, but God wants all of us to become witnesses to our love for Jesus and his people.

This is a high calling, so it's a good thing that Jesus has promised to give us himself as our strength for the battle. We are blessed that he offers us his own life so that we can find the grace to love unconditionally and forgive seventy times seven times—just as he does.

Many disciples who heard Jesus' teaching on the Bread of Life could not accept it. Why would they need his flesh and blood to have life with God? They already had the Law of Moses. But Peter saw through these objections and proclaimed: "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68). Just as God was the Israelites' only hope in conquering the Promised Land, Jesus was Peter's only hope in living a life of purity, love, and freedom.

You are about to receive Jesus in Communion. Look closely at the Host and the chalice. You are receiving something that has astonished believers for two thousand years. You may not understand this great mystery, but you can still echo Peter's words: "Master, where else can I go? You alone can give me what I need."

*"Jesus, I know that I am weak, but you are strong. Help me to follow you wherever you go."*

# **Readings for September 2**

#### Be doers of the word. (James 1:22) In today's second reading, James compares the Scriptures to a mirror. When we read the word of God, or when we hear it proclaimed at Mass, we often see ourselves in the stories and teachings it contains. Scripture helps us "discern reflections and thoughts of the heart," both the good thoughts and the not so good ones (Hebrews 4:12). Scripture can expose our pride, confront our resentments, or uncover our deception, greed, or lust. But at the same time, Scripture assures us that God made us in his image. It convinces us that God loves us and that his grace is more than enough to change our lives.

But no matter how much grace God has for us, James tells us that it's not enough just to hear the word of God—not if we want to see any significant changes in the sinful areas of our lives. Similarly, just hearing the word of God won't result in a growth in our gifts and virtues. We have to be "doers of the word" as well as "hearers" (James 1:22).

James gives us a wonderful image to help make this point: someone who hears the word but doesn't put it into action "is like a man who looks at his own face in a mirror. He sees himself, then goes off and promptly forgets what he looked like" (James 1:23-24).

James isn't speaking about a poor memory here. He's speaking about poor priorities. People "forget" Scripture because they have placed other priorities ahead of following the Lord.

The word of God does have the power to help us—but only to the degree that we cooperate with it. So be sure to read Scripture each day. But also be sure to write down one action step you can take based on what you have read. Then, dedicate your day to taking that one step at every opportunity. Let it help you say no to sin and yes to God today. If you do, you will be "blessed" beyond your expectations (James 1:25)!

# Lecturas del 26 de Agosto

**E**n el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús dio una enseñanza fundamental sobre el don de su cuerpo y su sangre, pero ni siquiera sus propios discípulos lograron entenderla bien y menos aceptarla.

Desde este momento, algunos de los que escuchaban a Jesús dejaron de seguirlo (Juan 6, 66) y, por consiguiente, no recibieron nada de él. Los que querían entender y acercarse a Dios recibieron la vida eterna, a pesar de que no podían comprender bien el significado de lo que Jesús decía. Quien tenga su razonamiento dominado por la cultura del mundo suele insistir en entender antes de creer. En cambio, el que le ofrece su mente al Espíritu, cree incluso antes de que pueda entender bien.

Si tratamos de analizar las verdades del Reino de Dios sólo con nuestro intelecto humano, concluiremos que el Evangelio es una tontería (1 Corintios 1, 18). No obstante, si queremos comprender lo que le agrada a Dios, es preciso pedir la iluminación del Espíritu Santo en la oración y la lectura de la Biblia, y buscar su voluntad a diario. No es raro que pensemos que si tuviéramos una mejor educación o fuéramos más inteligentes podríamos hacer lo que Dios quiere, ser "mejores" cristianos y entender más fácilmente su palabra. Frente a esto hemos de recordar lo que Jesús decía: "El Espíritu es el que da la vida; el cuerpo no aprovecha" (Juan 6, 63).

Para que entendamos o aceptemos la manera de pensar de Dios, hay que pedirle al Espíritu Santo que ilumine nuestro intelecto y corazón. El Señor dijo: "Así como el cielo está por encima de la tierra, así también mis ideas y mi manera de actuar están por encima de las de ustedes" (Isaías 55, 9). Todo lo que tenemos en la vida quedó contaminado por la desobediencia de Adán y, por consiguiente, no nos sirve para lograr un conocimiento personal y vivo del Padre. Es sólo mediante el Espíritu Santo que podemos comprender las verdades espirituales. Pidámosle al Señor que nos unja y nos ayude a entender más claramente las verdades de nuestra fe.

# Lecturas del 2 de Septiembre

Solution de la ley que no se percataban de que para Dios lo realmente importante era la práctica de la misericordia, la justicia y el amor.

Los fariseos tenían estas prioridades al revés, por eso Jesús les respondía a veces en forma abrupta y enérgica y les decía que examinaran primero su propio corazón antes de criticarlo a él.

Cuando reflexionamos en lo que el Señor dijo acerca del corazón humano y de todo lo malo que de él brota, es posible que algunos piensen que ya no hay perdón ni esperanza para ellos. Después de todo, es posible que algunos creyentes vean algo de su propia vida interior en la lista que presenta Marcos, y quizás por eso no quieren hacerse un profundo y detenido examen de conciencia, por temor a lo que puedan descubrir.

Pero el Señor nos invita a examinarnos el corazón, no para sentirnos condenados, sino para conocer la libertad y la paz de la conversión. Muchos santos han comentado que mientras más clara y profundamente vieron sus pecados, mejor pudieron reconocer la misericordia y el amor de Dios. Esta humildad no era cobardía, sino un reconocimiento de cuánto necesitaban al Señor y una confianza en que el poder de Dios actuaba en ellos. De hecho, consideraban que llegar a tal conocimiento de sí mismos era un privilegio, que siempre los acercaba más al Señor.

En la cruz, Cristo nos ha perdonado los pecados, y su Sangre preciosa allí derramada purifica el corazón y la mente de todos los fieles. Es decir, el Señor nos acepta aunque seamos imperfectos; simplemente nos pide que nos arrepintamos de nuestros pecados, lo amemos a él y cumplamos su voluntad. Para esto, conviene hacerse un buen examen de conciencia y tratar por todos los medios de demostrarle amor cumpliendo sus mandamientos.

#### Day 1, Wed, Nov 07: Depart for Mexico City

Celebrate Mass at the Basilica (total time of visit max 4 hrs). Visit Teotihuacan, then return to the hotel for a rest and group dinner at a local Mexican restaurant in the evening.

#### Day 3, Fri, Nov 09: Mexico City

Your day will begin with breakfast, followed by Mass at the Holy Family Church, where you will view the tomb of Fr. Miguel Agustin Pro, the Jesuit martyr. In a time of great religious persecutions, Fr. Pro was exiled from Mexico during the Mexican Revolution. However, he returned to Mexico and was aided by a secret ministry who helped him hide from authorities. During his time in Mexico, he assisted many individuals in their spiritual, as well as temporal, needs. Although he helped many, he was eventually arrested and killed by authorities. While at this church, you may pray to this great martyr who remained filled with the joy of serving Our Lord even in the midst of very difficult times. We will also visit the small but very inspiring Museum dedicated in honor of Father Pro. Time for a prayer and a special blessing. After this visit, you will tour the oldest and largest cathedral in all of Latin America, the Metropolitan Cathedral. Throughout your time in the cathedral, you will be overwhelmed by the stunning paintings, altar pieces, and statues. Your tour continues with a transfer to the National Palace. This extraordinary palace has been a building of the ruling class of Mexico since the Aztec Empire's rule. During this visit we will be able to view amazing murals painted by Diego Rivera. Continue our day with a visit to the Plaza of Santo Domingo. This plaza contains two Holy places that are architecturally exquisite: the Church of Santo Domingo, the first church built by the Dominicans in 1576; and the Shrine of Our Lady of the Rosary, the first Rosary Shrine in Mexico. You also visit the Shrine of Our Lady of Covadonga, the headquarters of the Confraternity of the Most Holy Rosary. This Shrine is dedicated to the Patron Saint of Asturias (Spain). Return to your hotel to enjoy a delicious dinner and rest before the next day of activities.

Day 4, Sat, Nov 10: Mass in the morning. Drive to Chapultepec. Today we will visit our choice of one or two museums— Museum of Anthropology, Museo del Tiempo, Palacio de Bellas Artes, Frida Kahlo, or Museum Dolores Olmedo. Lunch and visit of Coyoacan with free time. Return for dinner and overnight.

# Day 5, Sun, Nov 11: Church of Tulpetlac - Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe & Coyoacan

After breakfast, transfer to the Church of the 5th apparition, where the Blessed Virgin Maria de Guadalupe appeared to Juan Bernardino, Juan Diego's uncle. Here we can find a well of healing water from which locals drink, followed by a return visit to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe to attend Mass, and bid farewell to Mary the Mother of God. Continue on to Coyoacan. Upon arrival enjoy lunch, followed with a visit of the pretty plaza and suburbs of Coyoacan with its Church of St. John the Baptist. This church was originally constructed as a Dominican Monastery, but then changed to a Franciscan Monastery, where we will view the stunning architecture of seven chapels, as well as an altar piece that dates back to the seventeenth century. Free time to stroll around and make sure to taste the famous ice cream of Coyoacan, where during the weekend locals queue up to enjoy a delicious ice cream. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

#### Day 6, Mon, Nov 12: Return Home

This morning, transfer to the airport for your return flight(s) home. You will say farewell to friends and a pilgrimage that will last in your memory for years to come.


