READINGS FOR AUGUST 31

Get behind me, Satan! (Matthew 16:23) Amazing! In one moment, Jesus tells Peter that his words "You are the Messiah" had come from God himself (Matthew 16:17). Then, almost immediately afterward, because Peter is trying to dissuade him from the cross, Jesus rebukes him and calls him Satan. What happened?

In both cases, it was Peter's mind that came to these conclusions. It was Peter's voice that spoke the words. It was Peter's good intentions that motivated him. Yet one message came from God, and the other, from the devil. Even with the best of intentions, we can say and do things that help the devil instead of the Lord. This is why it's so important to try to develop the gift of discernment.

Even after this strong rebuke from Jesus, Peter continued to find himself influenced by the devil. At the Last Supper, he joined the other disciples in arguing about which of them was the greatest (Luke 22:24). Later that evening, he told Jesus that he would never deny him—but he did (22:31-34, 54-62). He even tried to keep Jesus from washing his feet (John 13:5-8). You would think that Peter would have learned by then!

But this isn't the whole story. Peter did grow in his ability to discern God's will. On Pentecost Sunday, his preaching converted thousands (Acts 2:37-41). His willingness to reach out to Cornelius and his family, even though they were Gentiles, enlarged everyone's view of God's plan (10:25-48).

Like Peter, we are going to be influenced by the devil and end up doing things that hinder God's plan. It's just the way we are as fallen people. But that's not the whole story. Jesus wants to teach us how to identify the devil's ploys. If you pray for grace and if you take time each day to reflect on your thoughts and actions, your gift of discernment will grow. You will think and act more like Jesus.

"Lord, fill me with your grace. Teach me to choose your will more and more."

READINGS FOR SEPTEMBER 7

L ove your neighbor as yourself. (Romans 13:9) Have you ever noticed how the commandments that we hear most often are the ones we have the hardest time fulfilling? Take today's second reading as an example. We all have to deal with people who try our patience or rub us the wrong way. Then there's the pull of the world, urging us toward a self-centered approach to life. And all the time, we hear in the back of our minds Jesus telling us to love one another, even to prefer one another to ourselves.

This is a demanding call, isn't it? Like Jesus, we should seek to serve instead of being served (Matthew 20:28). He asks us to take the "lowest place" at the banquet (Luke 14:9). He even warns us that if we strive to be first, we will be last, but if we strive to be last, we will be first (Matthew 20:16).

In today's readings, God is inviting us to do a little selfexamination. How have you done lately in loving your neighbor as yourself? Think about hurtful things you may have said about another person. Think about ways you may have failed to defend a friend or judged someone unfairly. Or maybe you have neglected to help a friend who needed you because it was inconvenient.

These are uncomfortable questions to ask, to be sure. But God knows your heart. He knows how much you want to do good, even though you fail at times. He also knows that he has placed his Spirit in you to give you divine strength and to make changes that seem impossible. So don't be afraid to open up to him and ask him to help you. Remember: God is love. And that love is generous and overflowing. Let him love you, and you'll find yourself loving other people more and more.

"Heavenly Father, forgive me for putting myself first. By your Spirit, teach me how to love. Father, unite all your children as one!"

FAITH FORMATION

Interested in Becoming Catholic? - "The RCIA, which stands for Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is a process through which non-baptized men and women enter the Catholic Church. It includes several stages marked by study, prayer and rites at Mass. Participants in the RCIA are known as catechumens. They undergo a process of conversion as they study the Gospel, profess faith in Jesus and the Catholic Church, and receive the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and Holy Eucharist. The RCIA process follows the ancient practice of the Church and was restored by the Second Vatican Council as the normal way adults prepare for baptism. In 1974 the Rite for Christian Initiation for Adults was formally approved for use in the United States" (www.usccb.org). The RCIA also is for adults baptized in other Christian traditions who wish to receive the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist in the Catholic Church and for adults who were baptized in the Catholic Church and wish to complete their initiation. os discípulos se sorprendieron cuando Jesús les dijo que debía ir a Jerusalén para sufrir y morir. Simplemente no podían entender que esta fuera la voluntad de Dios, después de que Pedro había proclamado que Jesús era "el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios vivo." ¡Era absurdo! Pero cuando Pedro trató de disuadir al Señor, Jesús lo reprendió severamente: "¡Apártate de mí, Satanás, y no intentes hacerme tropezar en mi camino, porque tu modo de pensar no es el de Dios, sino el de los hombres!"

Los cristianos estamos llamados a ser discípulos de Cristo: un privilegio y un desafío. El privilegio es que el discípulo adquiere una estrecha amistad con Dios. El mismo Jesús les dijo: "Ya no los llamo siervos... a ustedes los llamo amigos, porque les he dado a conocer todo lo que le he oído a mi Padre" (Juan 15, 15). Piensa en lo fantástico que es ser conocido como "amigo de Dios". ¡Qué magnífico honor!

El desafío es que en el camino del seguimiento a Cristo siempre surgen las dificultades, porque hay veces en que la limitada inteligencia humana tiene que enfrentarse al misterio de la sabiduría divina. Este proceso resulta a veces difícil; pero, así como a un niño le cuesta entender la prudencia de sus padres, así también el discípulo va creciendo en sabiduría a medida que acepta cada vez más la acción de Dios, que va formando en él un corazón nuevo.

Al principio, Pedro y los demás tuvieron dificultad para entender las obras de Dios, pero no por eso dejaron de obedecer. Al final, todos llegaron a ser faros de luz que proyectaron la gloria de su amado Maestro. El gozo y la fortaleza que Dios les dio, el fruto del íntimo conocimiento del amor de Dios, compensaron con creces el costo del discipulado. Y el Señor quiere que tú también seas su discípulo y un instrumento valioso en sus manos. ¿Lo aceptas? Si lo aceptas, serás "amigo de Cristo".

"Amado Señor, yo quiero servirte y ser discípulo tuyo, pero no siempre me siento capaz. Ayúdame, Señor, y dame lo que necesito para cumplir tu voluntad y seguir tu camino."

LECTURAS DEL 7 DE SEPTIEMBRE

J esús enseñó que, así como el buen pastor busca a la oveja perdida, así hay que buscar al hermano o hermana que ha pecado y perturbado la vida de la congregación. ¿Qué hacer en tales situaciones? Cuando nuestra parroquia, iglesia o grupo se ve alterado por la mala conducta de alguien, ¿amamos lo suficiente al culpable como para querer que regrese al redil? ¿O preferimos resolver el problema marginando al causante? San Pablo ofrece la perspectiva correcta para tales circunstancias, haciéndonos recordar que nuestra única deuda debe ser la del amor de unos a otros, en lo cual se resumen todos los mandamientos. De modo que nuestra principal responsabilidad es amar, y tratar así de lograr el arrepentimiento de los pecadores.

El Señor nos pide la unidad, pero no a cualquier precio. ¿Qué pasa si fracasan nuestros esfuerzos personales? Supongamos que ni siquiera la intervención de otro hermano o hermana mueve al culpable a recapacitar, y éste rehúsa escuchar a la Iglesia o a la comunidad. El Señor quiere que sepamos que, en tales casos, se puede marginar temporalmente a los que persisten en su conducta pecaminosa, pero nunca hacerlo por frustración, ira ni odio. Hay que darle al pecador toda clase de oportunidades para recapacitar y volver a la comunidad.

Es cierto que Jesús aconsejó a sus discípulos apartarse del ofensor "como de un pagano o de un publicano" (Mateo 18,17), pero no debemos olvidar cómo trataba él a tales personas: siempre dispuesto a perdonarlos y aceptarlos en su compañía: el propio Mateo fue testigo de ello.

Hay comentaristas que señalan que la amenaza de ser eliminado de la asamblea tenía como único fin sacudir un poco al pecador para hacerlo arrepentirse y regresar al rebaño. No hay duda de que esto coincide con la enseñanza de Jesús de que hay gozo en el cielo cuando se arrepiente un pecador.

"Señor, permíteme experimentar el mismo gozo que sienten tus testigos cuando ayudan a un pecador a arrepentirse y reincorporarse al rebaño, porque así 'salvo' a un hermano o hermana."

The English as a Second Language (ESL) Program forms part of the Cathedral's Social Justice & Community Services Ministries.

This all-volunteer program provides English language instruction to adults (ages 18 and up) during three semesters each year: Fall, Spring, and Summer. Language instruction is provided at Level I (Beginner) through Level 5 (Advanced) and classes are held at St. Matthew's Education Center, 1726 N Street, NW. The following is information regarding the upcoming Fall Semester.

Fall Semester of English as a Second Language

The 13-week Fall Semester will extend from September 16 to December 11. During this period, classes will be held Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30 pm, with optional tutoring from 6:00 to 6:30pm. Language instruction will be provided at Level I (Beginner) through Level 5 (Advanced). Students may register, in person, starting September 11, between 6:30 and 8:00pm, at St. Matthew's Education Center. At registration, each student will be assessed to determine the appropriate class level in which he/she will be placed. Student registrations will be accepted until October 7. 
