Readings for September 23

The Son of Man is to be handed over to men. (Mark 9:31) What a remarkable statement! As he begins his journey to Jerusalem, Jesus tells his disciples—and us—that he will be handed over. He will become passive, powerless in our hands. He will leave it up to us to decide what to do with him. It's just as the prophet Isaiah had said, "Like a lamb led to slaughter or a sheep silent before shearers, he did not open his mouth" (Isaiah 53:7).

This is a strong contrast to everything we have seen Jesus do so far. From the moment he burst onto the scene, Jesus was at the center of attention—healing people, contending with opponents, calming storms, and multiplying bread. He always took the lead. He always spoke with authority. He was the one shaping the story. But at the cross, where it matters the most? Jesus remained quiet, humble, and vulnerable.

The truth is, this is what Jesus intended all along. He came as God's gift to us. A gift doesn't tell the recipient how to use it. He left it up to us to decide how we were going to receive him. We didn't have to reject him as many of his people did. We didn't have to deny him as Peter did. We didn't have to kill him as the Romans did. We could have embraced him and accepted his message of salvation. But we didn't.

And still God handed him over. He didn't take back his gift.

Even today, God continues to hand Jesus to us. At every Mass, on every altar, in every Communion line, Jesus is placed in our hands as God's gift of salvation. None of us are worthy to receive him. None of us accept him as fully as we should. But that doesn't stop him. He still gives himself to sinful men and women. He still offers his salvation to us. Let's return his gesture and hand ourselves over to him.

"Lord, I am not worthy to receive you. Please keep speaking your words to me so that I may be healed."



Solemnity of St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist, our Patron Saint – Our Cathedral parish honors its patronal feast at the 11:30am and 1pm Masses today, **September 23**. Jesus' calling of Matthew to discipleship is the subject of the Gospel reading at these two Masses. This Gospel event is depicted in the mural in the west transept of the Cathedral entitled *The Calling of St. Matthew*. Take a moment and take a look!

Red Mass – The 66th Annual Red Mass will be celebrated at the Cathedral on Sunday, September 30 at 10am. The John Carroll Society hosts the Red Mass for its members and guests, including many government officials with attendant security. It is open to the public, but attendance is very high. If you normally attend the 10am Mass, you may wish to attend another Mass that weekend. The 8:30am Mass is cancelled that day. If you plan to attend the Red Mass, please arrive early as the fire marshal will not allow entry once the Cathedral is filled. Thank you for helping us extend the Cathedral's hospitality for this celebration.

Great Organ Completion Update – Twenty-three years ago, the first phase of the installation of our Great Organ was begun. Although it is visually impressive and appears complete, only 2/3 of the pipes were installed then. Even unfinished, it was hailed as one of the most impressive pipe organs in the region and is perfectly enhanced by the acoustics of our Cathedral.

A partial dismantling of the organ began in late June. New structural supports for the new chests were installed in August. Last week, Bombarde pipes and chests were installed. In October you will see scaffolding and some façade pipes missing. The four new manuals and the balance of the new pipes will be installed. When the organ is complete in early winter, you will notice dozens of sounds that you have never heard before. It will be as if whole sections of an orchestra that have been silent are now playing!

None of this would have been possible without the generous support of hundreds of parishioners and friends who have embraced the vision of a completed instrument and sacrificed to make it possible.

uando Jesús iba con sus discípulos rumbo a Jerusalén, predijo por segunda vez su muerte y su resurrección.

Para ser importantes en el Reino de Dios no hace falta ser líderes en la iglesia, tener un doctorado en teología, ni ser director de una institución de caridad o servicio social. Todos estos trabajos son importantes y valiosos, pero no garantizan la grandeza en el Reino de Dios, a menos que vayan acompañados de una humilde actitud de servicio, como la de Cristo.

Nuestro servicio ha de comenzar en la propia familia o comunidad religiosa. Los esposos deben ayudarse mutuamente y alentarse el uno al otro con amor. Los ministros ordenados y los que tienen votos religiosos pueden hacer lo mismo. Los padres pueden servir a sus hijos dándoles ejemplo: enseñándoles acerca del amor de Dios, la obediencia y el respeto. Los hijos pueden servir a sus padres respetándolos y obedeciéndoles, en lugar de ser rebeldes y quejarse contra ellos. Podemos servir a los necesitados de nuestras comunidades (los sin casa, los inválidos, los ancianos, los enfermos) brindándoles compañía, donándoles alimentos y ropa y compartiendo el amor de Dios. 
