TODAY'S READINGS

Jing at his door was a poor man. (Luke 16:20)
Some theologians believe that few will go to heaven. Other theologians hold that the mercy of God is so great that many, if not most, will go to heaven. But no one knows for sure.

Today's Gospel is a story about the relationship between a man who lived in luxury and went to hell and a frail beggar, who went to heaven. The rich man may have been a good and honest man. We don't know, and Jesus doesn't include this detail in his parable. We do know that he loved his five brothers, but he was also indifferent to poor Lazarus.

The Bible has countless references to the poor and the forgotten (Micah 2:9; Isaiah 58:7; Nehemiah 5:1-5; Matthew 5:42; 25:31-36). Most of these passages tell us that God expects those who have more to help those who have less. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "God blesses those who come to the aid of the poor and rebukes those who turn away from them" (2443).

If we own a piece of property, we have legal title in the eyes of the law. However, in the eyes of God, we are only his tenants. We are just stewards of his property. At the final judgment, God will ask us about our stewardship, especially our care for the poor (Matthew 25:14-30).

This was the rich man's problem. He was God's caretaker. He owed his wealth to God. What he failed to see was that the beggar Lazarus was God's representative, a person who deserved to be treated much better. All he could see was a ragged, diseased man.

Scripture tells us to share our clothes and our food and to care for the sick and the lonely (Matthew 25:35-36; Luke 3:11). It tells us that every human being has the right to live in dignity and to not go hungry or homeless. Today, let's ask, "What sacrifices can my family make so that we can reach out to the poor more fully?"

"Jesus, you became poor so that we might become rich. Help me be as generous as you are."

l rico y Lázaro vivían en mundos opuestos, aunque estaban lado a lado. El rico jamás entró en el mundo del mendigo y ni siquiera veía que Lázaro fuera un ser humano, mucho menos su prójimo, con quien compartía la común condición humana. Era absolutamente indiferente al sufrimiento del pobre, y como lo escuchamos hoy, la indolencia puede ser mala consejera y separarnos de Dios.

¿Cómo puede ser esto? Las riquezas llevan a una persona a preocuparse sólo de sí misma; la ciegan ante la necesidad de otros y le endurecen el corazón. Esa es la verdadera tragedia. Una persona, una familia, o todo un país pierde su alma cuando se dedica sólo a acumular riquezas.

Liturgical Ministries

Introduction. With the liturgical reform of Vatican II, four functions associated with the Mass were revised to enable the members of the worshipping community to assume particular duties that enable and encourage the whole assembly of faithful to be more intensely involved in the celebration of Mass. These functions or duties we know today as "ministries." Of particular note is the openness of these ministries to adults and young people, both male and female. Their direct participation in these ministries is a visible sign of how the whole assembly of faithful involves itself in the Eucharistic celebration.

Lector (**or Reader**). The one who proclaims the readings from Sacred Scripture during the liturgy, except for the Gospel which is reserved to the deacon or priest in the deacon's absence. Traditionally, the office of lector is a transitional point in preparation for ordination to the office of deacon. Although still an officially "instituted" ministry, the role is now generally open to the laity. Those proclaiming Scripture need to be mindful of *telling* the story, not *reading* it; to be sensitive to the nature of the reading; for example a *narrative* from Kings or Deuteronomy, an *angry outburst* from Jeremiah or a *poem* from Isaiah. Equally important is a keen sense of pacing and phrasing: waiting until the people are settled and ready, then grabbing their attention with the first words and articulating the particular pattern of the text. Finally, there is the "breath-taking" pause before announcing "The Word of the Lord" in such a way as to invite the assembly's response "Thanks be to God."

Acolyte. Derived from the Greek word for 'helper,' this office of acolyte is a transitional point preparing for ordination as deacon and still remains an officially instituted office of the Church. Nevertheless, many of the "helper" duties of acolyte, previously performed by men and boys, have now been extended to women and girls as well. Some of the acolyte's duties such as cross-bearer, candle-bearer, book-bearer, incense-bearer and table-preparer have traditionally been performed by young boys/men, but now are open to all lay persons. Another word used for this ministry has been "server" which is more and more is a misnomer, since all ministries associated with the liturgy are in "service."

Communion (Extraordinary Minister of Communion). A special term describing persons designated to assist the ordinary ministers of Communion (priest, deacon or acolyte) in sharing the consecrated bread and wine with the assembly. The term "extraordinary" is used to distinguish them from the ordinary ministers. Like other ministers to the assembly gathered for liturgy, these ministers also must be truly present in demeanor at the time they are fully sharing Christ with members of the assembly. When they announce "The body of Christ" or "The blood of Christ," they speak not only of their own faith, but they call forth the faith of the communicant who responds "Amen." These special ministers also go from the gathered assembly to share the communion of Christ with the absent sick or homebound.

Hospitality (**Usher or Greeter**). In earlier times, one might have heard this role referred to as 'porter', the one who opened the gate or door to welcome those who sought shelter, food or other aid. Today, those who fulfill this ministry set the tone for those who enter to worship. Their demeanor or attitude is an important quality for helping people to feel more a part of the worshipping community and to encourage the members to take an active role in celebrating the liturgy. Their encouragement before, during and after the liturgy is vital to the faithful's deeper experience of the Eucharist. Hospitality is an essential characteristic that should be visible in all our ministers of the liturgy, AND the assembly as well.


