

TODAY'S READINGS

The Lord is gracious and merciful. (*Psalm 145:8*)
From the general audience of Pope Francis, January 13, 2016:

"In Sacred Scripture, the Lord is presented as a 'merciful God.' This is his name, through which he unveils, so to speak, his face and his heart to us. As the Book of Exodus recounts, on revealing himself to Moses he defined himself in this way: '*the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness*' (*Exodus 34:6*). . . .

"The Lord is 'merciful': this word evokes a tender approach like that of a mother toward her child. . . . The image it suggests is that of a God who is moved and who softens for us like a mother when she takes her child in her arms, wanting only to love, protect, help, ready to give everything, even herself. . . .

"It is also said of this merciful God that he is '*slow to anger*'. . . . God knows how to wait, his time is not the impatient one of man; he is like the wise farmer who knows how to wait, allowing time for the good seed to grow, in spite of the weeds (*Matthew 13:24-30*)."

"Lastly, the Lord proclaims himself '*abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness*'. How beautiful this definition of God is! . . . The word 'love,' used here, indicates *affection, grace, goodness*. It is not soap opera love. It is love which takes the first step, which does not depend on human merit but on immense gratuitousness. It is divine solicitude that . . . is able to go beyond sin, to overcome evil and forgive it."

"Abounding in '*faithfulness*': this is the final word of God's revelation to Moses. . . . Faithfulness in mercy is the very being of God. For this reason God is totally and always trustworthy. . . . This is the assurance of our faith. Thus, in this Jubilee of Mercy, let us entrust ourselves to him totally, and experience the joy of being loved by this 'God who is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in love and faithfulness.'"

"Father God, thank you for being so loving and merciful toward me."

NOVEMBER REMEMBRANCES

November Masses for the Deceased – We remember our deceased loved ones in a special way throughout November. Each day a special Mass is offered in the Cathedral for this intention. Special envelopes are provided in the pews so that you can list the names of the deceased to be remembered at these daily Masses. The envelopes, which can be dropped in the collection basket or at the rectory, will be placed on the altar in the Wedding Chapel.

All Saints and All Souls – On Tuesday, **November 1**, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation. LECTURAS DE HOY

Hoy ha llegado la salvación a esta casa. (Lucas 19, 9)
 Cuando Zaqueo descubrió quién era Jesús, se sintió conmovido y dijo: "Mira, Señor, voy a dar a los pobres la mitad de mis bienes, y si he defraudado a alguien, le restituiré cuatro veces más" (Lucas 19, 8). Estas son expresiones de un hombre transformado en su espíritu, para quien amaneció la luz y llegó la salvación. Es la manifestación de alguien que ha conocido a Jesús y ha sido liberado para amar y servir a Dios y al prójimo.

Los recaudadores de impuestos eran despreciados por los judíos devotos. Eran gente rica, pero conocidos como engañadores, deshonestos y explotadores. Zaqueo era un "jefe de cobradores de impuestos y persona de mucho dinero" (Lucas 19, 2), es decir, era la personificación de todo lo que los judíos despreciaban, aparte de que dirigía las actividades de los demás recaudadores que tenía a su cargo.

No se sabe cuál era su motivación, pero nos consta que Zaqueo quería conocer a Jesús, y como era bajo de estatura subió a un árbol para verlo mejor. El Señor, viendo su afán, le dijo: "Zaqueo, bájate pronto, porque hoy tengo que hospedarme en tu casa." En otras palabras: "Baja, Zaqueo, no puedes conocerme si me ves sólo de lejos, porque el pecado no te deja ver bien y apenas puedes conocer algo de mí. Si de veras quieres conocerme, entrégate a mí y arrepíntete de tus pecados. Entonces, yo te perdonaré, te sanaré y te daré una nueva vida."

Zaqueo obedeció al instante, lleno de alegría. No sabemos cómo fue la visita de Jesús a su casa, pero una cosa es cierta: Zaqueo llegó a ser una persona completamente diferente. Se sintió liberado, pudo reconciliarse con aquellos a quienes había estafado y aprendió a amar y servir a sus conciudadanos de una manera diferente.

"Amado Jesucristo, mi Señor, yo también quiero conocerte personalmente. Te invito a venir a cenar en mi casa, es decir, que entres en mi corazón, y así me des una vida nueva de paz, armonía y salud, no sólo a mí sino a mi familia también. Gracias, Señor."


