

Readings for November 4

Fear the Lord, your God. (*Deuteronomy 6:2*) What does it mean to fear the Lord? Should we really be afraid of him? Well, we should never minimize these words since they appear more than three hundred times in Scripture. But fearing God is not the same as living in terror of him. It's more about having a proper reverence for him.

As with so many other truths in the Bible, fearing the Lord is a different thing than the earthly kind of fear we are all familiar with. It is a positive disposition, not a negative one. It's a way of building our faith and deepening our relationship with God, not keeping us distant from him.

At its heart, fear of God helps us to say no to our sinful desires. It functions more as a way of protection than as a means of oppression. It's fear of God that moves us to say, "I don't want to say or do anything that will cause me to be separated from my heavenly Father."

Parents instill a similar "loving fear" in their children. They teach their children to stay within certain boundaries of speech and behavior so that they can grow up to be responsible, respectful adults. For their part, children know that consequences will follow if they cross these boundary lines. And so a certain "loving fear" lays the foundation for wisdom in the children. It's in a similar way that Scripture tells us that "fear of the Lord" is the beginning of wisdom (*Proverbs 9:10*).

Fear of the Lord is a tool that keeps us safe as we grow and mature. And like all learning tools, it is helpful for only a time. Eventually, this godly fear should give way to love, because "perfect love drives out fear" (*1 John 4:18*). This is a lifelong process, of course, but it's encouraging to know that even godly fear can dissipate as love grows.

So let's all take to heart God's greatest commands: "Love the Lord, your God, with all your heart" and "Love your neighbor as yourself" (*Deuteronomy 6:5; Leviticus 19:18*).





Parents should contact us at least six (6) months in advance of a desired baptismal date, and may ask for the priest or deacon of their choice to perform the Baptism. Early contact allows parents to be scheduled for the necessary sacramental formation session and godparents to obtain letters from their pastor. Lecturas del 4 de Noviembre

Amarás al Señor, tu Dios, con todo tu corazón... (*Marcos 12, 30*) El escriba que se acerca a Jesús y le pregunta cuál es el mandamiento más importante no se presenta con alguna intención solapada, sino para hacerle a Jesús una pregunta sincera. Las escuelas rabínicas de esa época enseñaban que había mandamientos "graves" y otros "leves", de modo que los rabinos tenían razón al querer saber cuál de todos los mandamientos era realmente el más importante.

Jesús responde citando al pie de la letra el pasaje del Deuteronomio (primera lectura), pero añade inmediatamente el mandamiento del amor al prójimo, que se halla en otro contexto (*Levítico 19, 18*). Para Jesús ambos mandamientos son como uno solo: "No hay mandamiento mayor que éstos". Y es que no se puede amar a Dios sin amar al prójimo (*1 Juan 4, 20*). Este mandamiento del amor es el fundamento de la piedad verdadera. Por eso, el Señor le dijo al escriba: "No estás lejos del Reino de Dios" (*Marcos 12, 34*).

El mensaje para nosotros es claro: ¡Que el Reino de Dios es accesible! Si queremos tener parte en él, debemos entrar y permanecer amando a Dios y al prójimo. Pero este amor no es solo un sentimiento, sino el reconocimiento por fe de que Dios es amor (*1 Juan 4, 8*) y que solo por medio de él y por su gracia divina, podemos amarnos unos a otros. No basta nuestra propia fortaleza para amar al prójimo, pues naturalmente no estamos capacitados para hacerlo.

Dios ha depositado su amor en nosotros y nos ha dado su gracia para amar a los demás, a fin de que entendamos lo que es el amor auténtico, el amor divino que nos sana y nos libera de todo lo que nos impide amar. Por consiguiente, no digamos: "No puedo amar a tal persona, ni perdonar a esa otra." Por el contrario, creamos que el Espíritu Santo, que nos revela interiormente el amor de Dios, nos capacita para amar y perdonar. La respuesta es, pues, acudir al Padre y dejar que él nos enseñe a amar y nos sane, para que aprendamos a amar, pues si insistimos en confiar más en nuestros propios recursos, fracasaremos.

"Padre eterno, concédenos tu luz para reconocer nuestras propias virtudes y defectos y así podremos aceptar tu amor y tu gracia."


