

Readings for November 18

Of that day or hour, no one knows. (*Mark 13:32*) When Jesus said that “no one knows” when the Second Coming would happen, was he saying that even he didn’t know? It sure seems that way. Maybe he was reminding us that he had submitted to the limitations of being human, just like us. Yes, he was fully divine, but he was also fully human. And that entailed certain limitations. This is why Luke tells us that Jesus was always increasing in wisdom “before God and man” (*Luke 2:52*).

Today, however, Jesus knows when he will come again. The problem is, we still don’t know!

Repeatedly throughout history, people have tried to predict the end of the world. St. Paul thought it was just around the corner. St. Hippolytus of Rome and St. Irenaeus of Lyon thought it would happen in AD 500. John Wesley, the first Methodist, thought the end would come in 1836. Many Christian leaders—and no shortage of psychics—have also weighed in. Not surprisingly, many of these people then recalculated the dates after their first predictions didn’t come true, only to have their followers disappointed again.

Some believers are more cautious. They tell us that we will see specific clues when the time is near. They point to certain signs—a war in the Middle East, a drought in Africa, earthquakes in Peru, or some other disaster. When those signs occur, it means that Jesus is very near.

Still, no human being knows when Jesus will come. It could be today. It may not be for thousands of years.

St. Francis had a different take on the subject. Once, when he was working in the garden, a friar asked, “What would you be doing now if you knew that Jesus was coming back today?” Francis replied, “I would keep hoeing my garden.” Francis knew he was trying his best to be ready, and there was nothing more he could do.

The point is, Jesus *will* come. So our best answer is the same as it has always been: be ready.

“Come, Lord Jesus!”



Parents should contact us at least six (6) months in advance of a desired baptismal date, and may ask for the priest or deacon of their choice to perform the Baptism. Early contact allows parents to be scheduled for the necessary sacramental formation session and godparents to obtain letters from their pastor. Lecturas del 18 de Noviembre

Podrán dejar de existir el cielo y la tierra, pero mis palabras no dejarán de cumplirse. (Marcos 13, 31)

La mayoría de las personas, incluso creyentes, no piensan con frecuencia en la Segunda Venida de Cristo. La idea de morir y presentarse a juicio ante Dios, o peor aún, de que Jesús aparezca de repente y nos juzgue sin aviso previo es capaz de llenarnos de nerviosismo e inseguridad. Pero esta no es la actitud que la Iglesia quiere que tengamos al pensar en el grandioso y triunfante regreso de Cristo en toda su gloria.

Citando al profeta Daniel, el Señor dijo que “Verán venir al Hijo del hombre sobre las nubes con gran poder y majestad” (Marcos 13, 26; Daniel 7, 13). Para todos los que creemos y confiamos en Cristo, su Segunda Venida será una ocasión de enorme gozo y júbilo; será el momento en que nuestro Rey y Maestro volverá a la tierra a librarnos de una vez por todas de las lágrimas y los dolores causados por el pecado que ha infectado al mundo entero. 


