

Readings for November 25

My kingdom does not belong to this world. (John 18:36)
According to Scripture, Cain, who killed his brother Abel, also founded the first city (Genesis 4:17). From that point on, violence has been a part of every kingdom in history. Just about any ruler you can name has used some form of violence in order to “keep the peace” and hold onto their power. Even the great King David advised his son Solomon to assassinate his political opponent as a way of consolidating Solomon’s rule after David’s death (1 Kings 2).

No wonder Jesus said his kingdom was not of “this world” (John 18:36)! He came as the “Prince of Peace,” not a calculating dictator (Isaiah 9:5). This is what makes today’s Feast of Christ the King so special. It’s the celebration of a new kind of King, who is ushering in a new kind of kingdom.

Jesus’ kingship is unlike any we have ever seen. Instead of exerting power over his people, he submitted himself to their power—even if it meant letting them put him to death. And because he refused the temptation to lord it over his people, God raised him up and established him as the one true King over all of creation.

And the kingdom Jesus rules? It’s a kingdom of converted hearts. It’s a kingdom of people who have renounced sin and violence and who are striving to live in peace and justice.

Of course, we’re not perfect. We still commit sins. We still resort to violence—even subtle forms of violence—to get our way. But rather than use the threat of external violence to force us to behave, Jesus our King treats us with kindness and unexpected, undeserved, scandalous mercy. He softens our hearts and asks us to love each other as he loves us—humbly, preferring each other to ourselves.

Jesus, King of the Universe, has come to overthrow sin through love, violence through peace, and injustice through mercy. This kingdom is not of this world. It’s far more glorious!

Early contact allows parents to be scheduled for the necessary sacramental formation session and godparents to obtain letters from their pastor. Lecturas del 25 de Noviembre

En 1925, el Papa Pio XI instituyó la Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo, con la que se inicia la última semana del año litúrgico.

El objetivo de esta fiesta es celebrar la soberanía universal de Jesucristo, nuestro Señor, cuyo Reino es para nosotros la salvación del engaño mortal del pecado que abunda en el mundo, así como la revelación de Dios y nuestra reconciliación con él.

El Reino de Jesucristo no es de este mundo, pero es el Reino de la paz y el amor que él estableció en la tierra y a todos los creyentes nos invita a entrar en él. Cristo Rey anuncia la verdad y la verdad es la luz que ilumina el camino angosto, pero recto, que él, con su Vía Crucis, nos abrió hacia el Reino de Dios.

Pero qué es el año litúrgico. El año litúrgico es el calendario de los diversos tiempos y solemnidades que celebra la Iglesia según la vida, la muerte y la resurrección de Cristo y las celebraciones de los santos durante el año. Es un camino de fe que nos adentra en el misterio de la salvación.

El año litúrgico comprende los distintos tiempos de la Iglesia, de acuerdo con la celebración de alguno de los misterios de la vida de Cristo, a saber: Comienza con el Adviento y sigue con la Navidad, Epifanía, primer Tiempo Ordinario, Cuaresma, Semana Santa y Triduo Pascual, Tiempo Pascual, Pentecostés, segundo Tiempo Ordinario, para terminar con la Solemnidad de Jesucristo, Rey del Universo.

En cada tiempo litúrgico, la casulla del sacerdote es de un color diferente: blanco en el tiempo de Navidad y Pascua, verde en el Tiempo Ordinario, morado en Adviento, Cuaresma y Semana Santa y rojo en las fiestas de los santos mártires y Pentecostés.

Ahora, al concluir el año litúrgico, conviene hacerse un examen personal para ver si durante el tiempo transcurrido hemos vivido de acuerdo con la voluntad y el ejemplo de nuestro Rey. Preguntémonos: ¿Estoy yo contribuyendo a la evangelización de la sociedad, estoy buscando mi santificación personal y la de mis seres queridos, y estoy glorificando a Dios con mis actos y palabras?




