

READINGS FOR DECEMBER 21

The Lord ... will establish a house for you. (*2 Samuel 7:11*) Imagine David's surprise when God denied his request to build a temple but promised instead to build a house for David—a royal dynasty that would never end!

Like David, we often think that human hands can build a house for God. We think if we spend enough time accomplishing tasks in our churches or doing enough charitable works, we can establish his kingdom on earth. We tend to forget that the Christian life has just as much to do with humbly receiving unmerited grace from a powerful and generous God. We tend to forget God's greatest desire—to build his personality, his priorities, and his passions within us.

There is a wonderful story about the late Vietnamese cardinal Nguyen Van Thuan who, while still a young bishop, was arrested and imprisoned by his government. Van Thuan was so devastated at not being able to complete the projects that he had started for God that he went nights without sleeping. Then one night he heard a voice saying, "Everything you have done and desire to continue doing ... are God's works, but they are not God. Choose God and not the works of God."

These words changed Van Thuan's whole way of thinking. He found a new peace and strength to surmount moments in prison that were almost unbearable.

In his book, *Testimony of Hope*, Cardinal Van Thuan referred to Mary as a prime example of choosing God and not the works of God. "She abandoned her projects without fully understanding the mystery that was being accomplished in her body and in her destiny." By her fiat, Mary allowed God to build within her a house for Jesus Christ, the King of kings and Lord of lords. May we follow her example and let God build his house within and among us.

"Jesus, I surrender to you. Come and dwell within me, so that I may give you glory."

READINGS FOR DECEMBER 28

My son, take care of your father. (*Sirach 3:12*) Have you heard of the “sandwich generation?” It doesn’t have to do with food; it’s the situation many adults find themselves in, sandwiched between children and aging parents who need their care. In fact, a 2013 study found that in the United States, one in seven middle-aged adults provide financial support to their parents and their children, and almost three times that amount provide emotional support.

So how does God make us holy in the midst of these pressures? Don’t forget, our relationship with God, though personal, is meant to be lived out in community and not just individually. And the first and most important community is the family! It’s precisely through the ups and downs of family life that God forms his character in us. It’s a give-and-take; sometimes it’s our turn to give, and other times to receive.

If you’re on the receiving end, let people care for you! Chances are you’ve given much to your family over the years. Remember: as you receive, you are also giving a gift. You are giving them the chance to show their gratitude and to grow in becoming more like Christ. Taking care of your needs could be a pivotal experience in their relationship with God. It’s also a great way for you to grow in detachment and humility!

If you’re being called to give more, try to see in each needy family member the Christ child himself. How would you love him? What would you give to him? Believe that in loving and serving your family, you are loving and serving Jesus—and that he will bless you deeply for it.

On this feast day, God wants us to know that we can all become holy families. Through his grace, your family can become more of a living reflection of his love and life. Your actions in caring for each other and receiving that care will actually enflesh his love in the world.

“Father, pour out your grace and make every family a living icon of your love.”



LECTURAS 21 DE DICIEMBRE

Hoy, San Lucas nos presenta aquella magnífica realidad creada por Dios, cuyo punto culminante es: “Vas a concebir y a dar a luz un hijo y le pondrás por nombre Jesús” (Lucas 1, 31). La Navidad está ya cerca y María nos abre la puerta colaborando con la obra de Dios.

Cuando escucha sorprendida el anuncio del ángel, María vive momentos dramáticos: Es virgen y ahora, antes de casarse, Dios le propone ser madre. Como no lo entiende, el ángel le aclara que la obra se realizará por la gracia del Espíritu Santo, porque para Dios no hay nada imposible. No es que luego ella lo entienda mejor, pero la explicación le basta y responde: “Hágase en mí según tu palabra”, es decir, “Cúmplase en mí lo que me has dicho.” ¡Sí, que así sea! ¡Fiat, hágase! En aquel mismo instante, “Aquel que es la Palabra se hizo hombre y habitó entre nosotros” (Juan 1, 14).

Y contemplamos esta escena impresionante de la Anunciación, el acontecimiento más grandioso de la historia de la Humanidad: Dios, el Creador y Señor de todas las cosas, se hace hombre como nosotros.

La forma es sencilla; el acontecimiento, de magnitud cósmica. Como son también inmensas las virtudes de la Virgen María: llena de gracia, humilde, sencilla, disponible ante la voluntad divina. Dios tiene sus planes para ella, como también para ti y para mí, pero él espera la cooperación libre y amorosa de cada uno para llevarlos a término. La respuesta de María no es tan sólo un sí al mensaje del ángel; es un ponerse totalmente en las manos de Dios Padre, un

abandonarse confiadamente a su providencia entrañable, un decir sí a dejar que el Señor haga su voluntad hoy y en todas las circunstancias de su vida.

Ahora que nos preparamos para celebrar la Navidad, la mejor manera de hacerlo es permanecer junto a María para esperar el nacimiento del Salvador. ¿Qué le vas a decir tú?

"Amado Señor Jesucristo, ¿qué puedo hacer yo para darte la bienvenida en mi corazón y llevar a otros a recibirte con amor y entrega? ¡Ayúdame, Señor, a imitar a tu Madre!"

LECTURAS 28 DE DICIEMBRE

En esta fiesta de la Sagrada Familia reflexionemos sobre nuestras propias familias. La Sagrada Familia es un modelo especial de amor, oración y cuidado mutuo que podemos seguir en todo momento porque es un modelo de la vida real. Toda familia humana tiene altibajos; las que llevan una vida apacible y feliz son generalmente las que han puesto a Dios en el primer lugar.

La familia y el matrimonio son como una red de pescar: Si todos los cabos están bien amarrados, resisten cualquier peso y presión.

De igual manera, las familias pueden recibir de las demás el apoyo de una gracia abundante.

Si te parece casi imposible compaginar el trabajo de criar a tus hijos, pregúntale a la Virgen María y a San José "¿Cómo criaron a Jesús?" This all-volunteer program provides English language instruction to adults (ages 18 and up) during three semesters each year: Fall, Spring and Summer. Language instruction is provided at Level 1 (Beginner) through Level 5 (Advanced) and classes are held at St. Matthew's Education Center, 1726 N Street, NW.

Spring Semester of English as a Second Language Classes

The 13-week Spring Semester will extend from **January 13 to April 9, 2015**. During this period, classes will be held Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30 pm, with optional tutoring from 6:00 to 6:30pm. Language instruction will be provided at Level 1 (Beginner) through Level 5 (Advanced). Students may register, in person, starting **Thursday, January 8**, between 6:00 and 8:00pm, at St. Matthew's Education Center, 1726 N Street, NW. At registration, each student will be assessed to determine the appropriate class level in which he/she will be placed. Student registrations will be accepted until February 5.
