

## TODAY'S READINGS

**W**e must obey God rather than men. (Acts 5:29)  
Is this the same Peter who had denied that he even knew Jesus? Doesn't it take years—if ever—for us to overcome our fears? Let's take a look at what happened in Peter to bring about such a transformation.

Spiritual transformation is usually connected to the grace of repentance. Luke tells us that just after Peter denied knowing Jesus three times, "the Lord turned and looked" at him. That look must have broken Peter's heart, because it moved him to "weep bitterly" (Luke 22:61, 62).

Jesus must have known that those tears would move Peter to repentance, because he told him at the Last Supper, "Once you have turned back, you must strengthen your brothers" (Luke 22:32). He told Peter to use this experience to warn, comfort, and sustain the members of his Church.

In addition to the grace of repentance, Peter received the grace of the Holy Spirit—a grace to help him keep Jesus in the forefront of his mind long after Jesus had ascended into heaven. It was the Holy Spirit, living and active in his heart, who kept encouraging and helping him to stay faithful to the call to obey God, even if it meant disobeying the Jewish elders.

Here's the good news: what happened to Peter can happen to us. We can be transformed! When we confess our sins, Jesus doesn't just forgive us. He teaches us how to use our experience of his mercy to comfort and sustain the people around us. And at the same time, he gives us a greater outpouring of his Spirit so that we can find the strength and courage to remain faithful to the Lord and his calling on our lives.

Obedying God's commands is meant to be a joy, not a burden. If we can learn to rely on God's grace—both the grace of repentance and the grace of the Holy Spirit—we will be transformed as well.

## LAS LECTURAS DE HOY

**E**sta fue la tercera vez que Jesús se apareció a sus discípulos después de haber resucitado." (Juan 21,14)

El Señor resucitado se apareció a los

discípulos cuando ellos volvían de su trabajo diario, un poco desorientados sobre lo que deberían hacer ahora que su maestro había muerto. Jesús se dirigió directamente a Pedro, a quien le confió la misión especial de ser pescador de hombres y pastor del rebaño de almas. Esta misión apostólica, encomendada en el contexto de la pesca milagrosa, tiene un significado simbólico, porque se

ve claramente que los resultados obtenidos son inmensamente mejores cuando se sigue el consejo del Señor. La gran pesca (Juan 21,6) indica la universalidad de la misión que Jesús encomendó a Pedro y a la comunidad de los apóstoles.

Pedro no recibió esta misión por su dignidad personal, ya que Cristo se la dio después de su traición y fracaso como discípulo, pero luego el apóstol reafirmó tres veces su profundo amor por Jesús, dándose cuenta de que no podía ser un buen discípulo apoyado en la confianza en sí mismo. El poder de la muerte y la resurrección de Cristo lo habían humillado y transformado y ahora podía aceptar la misión de cuidar las ovejas como pertenecientes a Cristo y no a él.

Todos los seguidores de Jesús estamos llamados a tener parte en la congregación de la nueva comunidad mesiánica de la Iglesia. Jesús no espera a que logremos la perfección antes de admitirnos al discipulado ni confiarnos la propagación de la buena nueva. Hoy, y cada día, Jesús está en la playa esperándonos. No importa que nuestros esfuerzos por evangelizar sean débiles o imperfectos; siempre podemos tener la certeza de que el llamamiento y la victoria emanan del poder de su muerte y su resurrección. Y este es un don gratuito que Él da a pecadores como todos nosotros.

## EXULTET AT THE AMBO

Are you wondering what that book is that is displayed in front of the ambo (pulpit)? This book is the illuminated chant of the great hymn of the resurrection that is chanted at the beginning of the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday evening. It is an ancient hymn sung, normally by the deacon, immediately after the incensing of the Paschal Candle. Scholarly research traces its origin to the 5th century. The first transcribed text was found in various liturgical manuscripts of the 7th century.

The “Exultet” book is placed before the ambo because it is sung at the ambo in the immediate proximity of the Paschal Candle, which represents the resurrected Christ. The “Exultet” is displayed during the Easter season until Pentecost Sunday. The special illuminations are derived from the artwork included by medieval monks who transcribed the chant onto rolls of parchment used by the deacon in chanting the text.

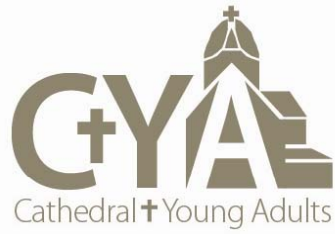

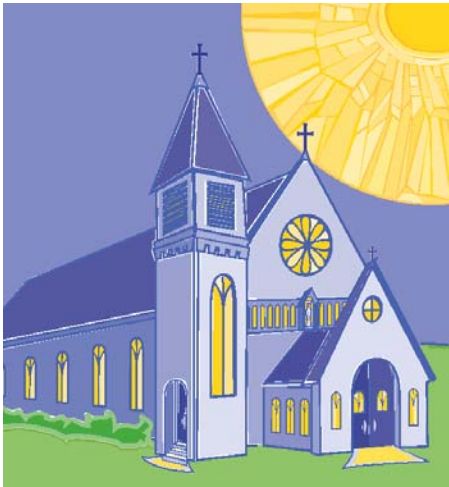
