e perfect. (Matthew 5:48)

Perfect? Isn't that impossible? Let's take a look. Before Jesus spoke these words, a workable system was already in place: "eye for eye, tooth for tooth" (Deuteronomy 19:21). This system was based on a kind of justice that helped

to limit retribution. No double or triple damage claims were allowed. I couldn't kill someone if he simply stole my camel. The most he would have to do is lose one of his camels to make everything "even." But Jesus wanted more than this equal-retribution approach. He wanted mercy to become the law of the land.

This new standard can seem unfair because it involves turning the other cheek, going an extra mile, and loving our enemies. We don't always do this with our family members; how are we supposed to do it with people who hate us?

When we are at odds with someone. unforgiveness is usually at the heart of the matter. So Jesus calls us to forgive. Of course, he doesn't expect us to feel the same amount of affection for everyone. But he does want us to treat everyone, even our enemies and those who have hurt us. as God treats them: with compassion, mercy, and patience. He wants us to pray for them and to wish them well.

This kind of love not only releases grace to the other person; it also releases God's grace upon us. Recent psychological studies back this up, in fact. They show that holding unforgiveness can lead to depression. It can fill us with resentment, make us cynical, and even affect our physical health. But people who practice forgiveness tend to be healthier and more at peace. So the more we try to follow Jesus' teaching, the more we benefit as well!

Do you want to be perfect? Try your best to forgive. It may seem impossible, but with God's help, all things are possible.

> terminan guardando por años, sin darse cuenta de que son ellos mismos los que sufren los efectos más nocivos.

Jesús no vino a abolir la ley, sino a perfeccionarla y elevarla a un plano muy superior, al plano del amor de Dios, cuando dijo: "Hagan el bien a los que los odian" (Mateo 5, 44), un principio que todavía nos sigue resultando extraño, exagerado o "ilusorio". Pero este es precisamente el amor divino, el amor que sana, el amor que reconcilia y el que desarma al enemigo.

Sí, es difícil hacerlo, sin duda, pero en lugar de quedarnos pensando en que no podemos hacerlo, demos gracias a Dios por todas las veces que hemos actuado con amor y hemos podido perdonar a otros, soportar una herida sin rencor o disculpar los errores ajenos. Para la mayoría de las personas, estos "triunfos" de la gracia

son más comunes de lo que se imaginan, y cada uno es motivo de gozo para nuestro Señor y de eterna recompensa para nosotros.

Todos sabemos que aún nos queda mucho por hacer en lo que se refiere al amor genuino y verdadero. ¿Cómo podemos desear el bien a quienes nos calumnian o acusan falsamente? ¿Perdonar de verdad cuando tenemos heridas que aún sangran? Es un error pensar que los traumas recibidos, las heridas aún abiertas o la dificultad de amar nos excusan de nuestra obligación cristiana; más bien, seamos dóciles a la acción del Espíritu Santo que habita en tu corazón, porque él está siempre actuando para hacer que su templo vivo (tú) esté adornado de hermosura y amor.






