

TODAY'S READINGS

He saved us and called us to a holy life. (2 Timothy 1:9)
St. Paul tells us that we have been called to a holy life. But if you sat in rush-hour traffic when you were already late for work; if you had a dispute with your spouse or boss; if you gave in to the same old temptation yet again—you might consider that holy life to be far, far away.

It isn't! Go back, and read that verse again. Paul says that God has called you to a holy life. He called you not because of what you can do, not because of what you have done, and not because of what you will do, but "according to his own design." It's his design. It's his call.

God has a plan for you. So often, we reduce that plan to the things we have to do, like spending time in prayer, confessing sin, sharing our faith, or serving at our parish. Of course, these are all good things, and we should seek God's guidance in them. But they are all small parts of God's greatest plan: to fill us with his divine life and usher us into the glory of heaven!

We know that the call to holiness can be challenging at times. But it's not always supposed to be hard. Sometimes it means gazing into the night sky and thinking about God's goodness. Sometimes it means enjoying a family gathering. At its heart, holiness is a deep assurance that God is with you at all times, whether you are experiencing prosperity or hardship, joy or struggle.

God has a plan for your life—a plan to bring you to holiness. He has the details under control, so don't worry about them. You will know some of the steps to take in advance, but others you will recognize only in retrospect. But whatever they are, each step will cause you to grow in love and knowledge of God: in holiness!

"Father, thank you for the life you have called me to. Give me grace to trust you with the details as I say yes to you."

LECTURAS DE HOY

En el relato de la Transfiguración, los apóstoles Pedro, Santiago y Juan tuvieron el privilegio de ver la apariencia que Cristo tendría en la resurrección y cuando regresara en toda su gloria. Por unos instantes vieron a Jesús que "ha sacado a la luz vida e inmortalidad por medio de la predicación del evangelio" (2 Timoteo 1, 10), y tal fue el impacto de la visión, y de la voz del Padre, que cayeron postrados en adoración (Mateo 17, 6).

Cuando los discípulos presenciaron la gloria que irradiaba de Jesús, lo vieron tal como se verá cuando vuelva al final de los tiempos. Pudieron ver algo del cumplimiento de la promesa, a fin de que cuando vieran que arrestaban a Jesús, lo maltrataban y lo crucificaban de la forma más cruel y humillante, no se sintieran aplastados. La promesa de las bendiciones de Dios prevalecería, y ellos verían que esta promesa sólo se cumpliría mediante la muerte del Hijo amado.

Ahora, Jesús está a la derecha del Padre, resplandeciente de gloria y nos ofrece ser partícipes de su gloria. Nosotros, al igual que Abraham, también estamos llamados a la obediencia y la confianza e invitados como Pedro, Santiago y Juan, a seguir a Cristo por el camino de la cruz (Mateo 16, 24-45). La promesa de bendición que recibió Abraham se extiende hasta nuestros días, una promesa de vida con Dios, promesa que ahora mismo podemos comenzar a experimentar por medio del Espíritu Santo que habita en nosotros.

En la oración de hoy adoremos al Señor de todo corazón. "Por su propio designio y su gracia [que] nos fue otorgada en Cristo Jesús antes de los tiempos" (2 Timoteo 1,9), él quiso redimirnos y llenarnos de su Santo Espíritu. Por eso, con gratitud y gozo, exclamemos junto con san Pedro: "Señor, ¡qué bien que estemos aquí!" (Mateo 17, 4).

"Señor Jesús, quiero ver tu gloria. Abre mis ojos espirituales para no fijarme tanto en las cosas creadas, sino en ti, el Creador de todo lo bello y lo puro. Te amo, Señor."

LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE – Ash Wednesday, **March 5**, and Good Friday, **April 18**, are days of fast and abstinence. All Catholics who have reached their 18th birthday and are less than 60 years of age are bound to observe the fast, by which they are limited to a single full meal during the course of the day. All Catholics who have reached their 14th birthday must observe days of abstinence, during which no meat may be eaten. Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

FAITH FORMATION

RCIA PENITENTIAL RITE FOR BAPTIZED CANDIDATES – This Sunday, **March 16**, at the 11:30am Mass, we will celebrate the Penitential Rite, which marks the Lenten purification of our baptized candidates who are preparing to receive the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. This rite also helps to prepare the candidates to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation (Penance) for the first time, which they will do later in Lent. Please keep these eight women and men in your prayers.

BIBLE STUDY ON THE GOSPEL OF JOHN – Father Hurley's Bible study on the Gospel of John continues Saturday, **March 22** from 10:30 to 11:45am in the East Conference Room. This session will focus on the Passion. Bring a Bible, and consider staying for our 12:10pm Mass afterward.

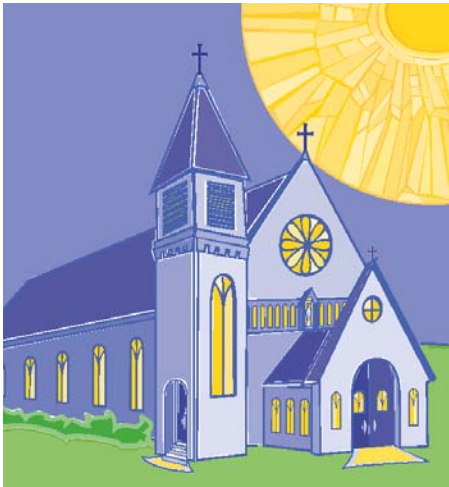
