### **TODAY'S READINGS**

Ather, I thank you for hearing me. (John 11:41)
You have probably prayed many prayers this Lent, maybe even for those who are sick or departed loved ones—the "Lazaruses" in your life. But does the thought ever creep in: God, are you even listening?

Perhaps we can take a cue from Jesus as he prayed for his friend Lazarus, who had just died. Rather than starting off with his specific request, he said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me" (John 11:41). Jesus offered words of gratitude for the greatest gift of all: God's friendship and love. He trusted that his Father knew what he needed before he even asked. He knew that his Father would give just the right gifts at just the right time—even if it meant that Lazarus wouldn't rise until the end of time.

Mary and Martha, women of great faith, expected that Jesus would come as soon as he got word that Lazarus was sick. But he delayed. As time passed, they too must have thought, God, are you listening? By the time Jesus arrived, Lazarus was already dead and decaying. But Jesus' delay had nothing to do with indifference. He was so moved by the women's distress that he wept at Lazarus' tomb. In the end, his delay led to an even greater miracle: not just a healing but an actual rising from death!

Jesus hears every prayer you make, even if he doesn't answer you right away. He weeps with you in your sorrow. He is with you, even when he is holding back his healing touch. He may not give you what you ask for, but he will give you something good—perhaps an increased compassion for other people's suffering or a greater healing further down the road. Best of all, he will give you the greatest of all gifts: an ever-deepening relationship with him

So run to the One who hears all your prayers. Go with confidence and trust. Jesus is with you. He will not abandon you!

"Lord, thank you for hearing me. I treasure the incredible gift that you are to me!"

### LECTURAS DE HOY

uando Jesús le dijo a Marta que Lázaro resucitaría, ella replicó: "Ya sé que resucitará en la resurrección del último día" (Juan 11, 24); pero el Señor lo resucitó de inmediato. A nosotros también nos cuesta reconocer que el Señor actúa aquí y ahora mismo. Por medio del Bautismo nos da la vida nueva, una vida de fe que es tan concreta como la que le devolvió a Lázaro cuando éste yacía en la tumba.

Lázaro fue un testigo tan poderoso del poder vivificante de Jesús que los jefes judíos quisieron matarlo (Juan 12, 10). Comentando sobre este episodio, san Agustín decía, irónicamente, que si hubieran matado a Lázaro, ¡Jesús simplemente lo habría resucitado de nuevo! (Homilías sobre san Juan 50, 14).

Casi 600 años antes del nacimiento de Jesús, el profeta Ezequiel tuvo una poderosa visión del Espíritu de Dios que resucitaba a su pueblo para darle una vida nueva. En el valle de los huesos secos profetizó diciendo: "Ven, espíritu, desde los cuatro vientos y sopla sobre estos muertos, para que vuelvan a la vida" (Ezequiel 37, 9). Del mismo modo que la resurrección de Lázaro, la visión de Ezequiel anuncia la vida nueva que Dios nos da hoy y al mismo tiempo la resurrección final de entre los muertos.

Un antiguo rabino judío, el Rabí Judá ben Simón, comentó sobre la visión de los huesos secos que tuvo Ezequiel para enseñar que la responsabilidad de escuchar la voz de Dios es nuestra: "[Dios] les dijo, 'descendientes de Jacob, familias todas de Israel, escuchen la palabra del Señor, y ustedes no escucharon; pero ahora han escuchado. Cuando estaban vivos no escuchaban, pero ahora que están muertos han escuchado!"" (Comentario Rabbah sobre Eclesiastés IV.3.1). En otras palabras, nos enseñó que debemos escuchar y aceptar la llamada de Dios en esta vida, porque no tendremos otra alternativa que escuchar la voz del juicio de Dios en el último día.

"Señor y Salvador nuestro, te rogamos que te muestres compasivo con nosotros, para que en la resurrección final nos encontremos reconciliados con Dios."

All Catholics who have reached their 18th birthday and are less than 60 years of age are bound to observe the fast, by which they are limited to a single full meal during the course of the day. All Catholics who have reached their 14th birthday must observe days of abstinence, during which no meat may be eaten. Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS** – The Via Crucis is a journey made in the Holy Spirit, the divine fire that burned in the heart of Jesus (cf Lk 1: 49-50) and brought him to Calvary. The Stations of the Cross, in the form adopted by Pope John Paul II, will be prayed each **Friday** during Lent in English at 6pm, each **Sunday** during Lent in Spanish at 2:15pm, and on **Good Friday** at 7:30pm. Join us for this beautiful devotion, which is particularly fitting for Lent.


