TODAY'S READINGS

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit. (Acts 2:4) Today we celebrate that great day when the Holy Spirit came upon Mary and the apostles. The power of God was on display in a dramatic way as three thousand people accepted the gospel, repented, were baptized, and joined the Church.

What followed was an exciting and continuous display of God's power. People came together for prayer and the Eucharist. Many were healed of sicknesses or delivered from demons. Some felt compelled to care for the poor, and others, to proclaim the gospel abroad. Despite tensions from within and persecution from without, the Church continued to grow, all because the Spirit was at work.

Not long after today's events, a "second Pentecost" occurred, this time to a group of Gentiles in Caesarea (Acts 10:44-48). Once again, Peter preached the gospel, the Holy Spirit was poured out, and many were converted. The people who had come with Peter—all faithful Jews—"were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles" (10:45). Then when Paul ventured out on his missionary journeys, the same thing happened: the gospel was preached, the Spirit was released, people were changed, and the Church grew.

You have the Holy Spirit no less than Peter and Paul and the apostles did. This same Spirit wants to help you draw close to Jesus, and he wants to make you into his instrument of salvation. So take some time today to accept the challenge. Ask him to guide you in the truth. Ask him to take from what is Jesus' and make it known to you (John 16:13-14). And then try your best to follow the apostles' example by looking for opportunities to share the good news so that the Spirit can touch more and more people.

"Come, Holy Spirit, and fill me with your love. Send your fire, and renew the face of the earth."

LECTURAS DE HOY

Pe una homilía de san León Magno (c. 400-461) "Si no me voy' Jesús dijo a sus apóstoles, 'no vendrá a ustedes el Paráclito; en cambio, si me voy, yo se lo enviaré' (Juan 16, 7). 'No se alejen de Jerusalén. Aguarden aquí a que se cumpla la promesa de mi Padre, de la que ya les he hablado: Juan bautizó con agua; dentro de pocos días ustedes serán bautizados con el Espíritu Santo' (Hechos 1, 4-5).

"Estas fueron las últimas palabras del Señor a sus discípulos... No que el Espíritu fuera a comenzar su trabajo entre los hombres sólo después de que Jesús hubiese retornado al Padre, porque ya estaba actuando en el mundo desde el amanecer de la creación. El pueblo de Dios no iba a experimentar una presencia hasta entonces desconocida del Espíritu Santo, sino que los que ya le pertenecían conocerían una efusión más abundante; no una primera recepción de sus dones, sino una mayor plenitud.

"Pentecostés es la culminación de la obra de nuestra salvación, aquel poderoso plan de la misericordia de Dios que se originó mucho tiempo atrás, cuando el Señor empezó recién a formar un pueblo para sí. ¡Cuántas señales misteriosas se descubren en esta fiesta, en la que se unen el antiguo y el nuevo designio divino, enseñándonos que la Ley de Moisés fue el heraldo de la gracia de Cristo, en la cual encontraría su cumplimiento!

"El perenne mensaje del Evangelio es que el Señor ha salvado a su pueblo; ha derrotado al pecado y a la muerte y nos ha dado una vida nueva como hijos adoptivos de Dios. Y porque somos hijos suyos, Dios ha enviado al Espíritu de su Hijo a nuestros corazones, para que clamemos, '¡Abba, Padre!' (Gálatas 4, 6). Ahora bien, donde está el Espíritu del Señor, ahí hay libertad (2 Corintios 3, 17). ¡Ya no somos esclavos, sino libres!"

CHILDREN'S RELIGIOUS EDUCATION -- ST. MATTHEW'S CATHEDRAL -- 2014-2015



The Religious Education program at St. Matthew's Cathedral exists to provide sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation as well as ongoing faith formation for children who have received these sacraments. It strives to communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ in the context of the beliefs and practices of the Roman Catholic Church. The program presents the four fundamental themes of the Catechism of the Catholic Church – Creed, Sacraments, Morality, and Prayer – in such a way that the children of our parish begin to understand how to live the Gospel.

When and where are classes held?

Classes are held weekly on Sunday mornings from 9:45 to 11am in the St. Matthew's Education Center located at 1726 N Street NW. It is expected that parents will attend a special class for them at the same time and that families will worship at either the 8:30am Mass before class or the 11:30am Mass following class. Classes generally are not held on holiday weekends.

When do classes begin?

There will be a mandatory parent-teacher meeting Sunday, September 7, 2014 from 9:45 to 11am in the North Conference Room. Classes will begin Sunday, September 14, 2014 and conclude in late May 2015.

How do I register my child(ren)?
