READINGS FOR JULY 6

Life is an adventure for little children. If you give them a present, they might play with the wrapping paper or the box it came in as much as the gift itself. Give a young boy a small fire engine, and he'll imagine himself putting out a giant fire. Give a young girl a doll, and she'll treat it as her own child. Children are also curious and imaginative, capable of intently focusing on the task at hand—especially when it comes to playtime!

Children have a tendency to keep things simple. They trust their parents. They believe everything their parents tell them. By contrast, we adults ask far too many questions. We like to think things through, weighing the pros and cons and examining every angle. While that's usually a good thing, too much examination can make it hard for us to be trusting. This is especially true when it comes to faith. That's why Jesus encourages us to be "childlike" (Mt 11:25).

Following Jesus is an adventure. It's about delving into the heart and mind of God. It's about, as St. Ignatius of Loyola used to say, using our imagination to picture ourselves in biblical times, watching Jesus multiply the loaves and fishes or journeying to the Promised Land with the children of Abraham. It's about being like an inquisitive child during story time: "Why did the food multiply? How can Jesus be everywhere at the same time? What does an angel look like?"

Whether you are at Mass, at prayer, or just talking to Jesus in the midst of your day, don't settle for the same old routine. Discipleship should be an adventure, so go ahead and ask him to open your eyes and give you new insights into his stories and his love for you.

One more thing: children love a good hug. So today, imagine Jesus putting his arms around you and drawing you close to his heart. Hear him telling you how precious you are to him. Dare to be a child again.

"Here I am, Jesus, ready for a new adventure with you today."

READINGS FOR JULY 13

y word ... shall not return to me void. (Isaiah 55:11)
A farmer is very careful during planting season.
He selects the best seeds, chooses the most fertile land, and plants each crop in just the right location. He does all of this in the expectation of a good harvest. Yet despite all his effort, he can't make the seeds grow. It's up to the seeds themselves.

By contrast, it's our heavenly Father who makes the seed of faith in our hearts grow and bear fruit. And he does it by pouring his word on us like a gentle rain shower.

Today's first reading tells how fruitful God's word is: it never comes back to him empty! His words are promises filled with divine potential. Every day, our Father speaks words of life over us. He tells us about his hope-filled plans for us (Jeremiah 29:11). He tells us about his everlasting love for us (31:3). He tells us that he delights in us (Isaiah 62:4). And he tells us that we are blessed because we can see signs of his presence in the world (Matthew 13:13). If we can accept these words, they will unleash grace in our lives that will make us into fruitful, attractive witnesses to our faith.

Do you want to bear fruit for the Lord? Then take hold of God's word and never let it go. Every day, spend time with the Scriptures. Let them speak to your heart. Let them form your mind. Let them guide your actions. If you haven't done it already, read the articles in the front of . . . (*The Word Among Us*). They're all about finding God's presence through his word, and they'll help you discover the grace that God has planted in you like a seed.

Jesus is speaking his word to you all the time. Right now, at this very moment, he wants to tell you something. Take the time to listen.

"Father, open my eyes to see you. Open my ears to hear you. Open my heart to receive you. Come, Lord, and speak life to my soul!"

Interested in Becoming Catholic? - "The RCIA, which stands for Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is a process through which non-baptized men and women enter the Catholic Church. It includes several stages marked by study, prayer and rites at Mass. Participants in the RCIA are known as catechumens. They undergo a process of conversion as they study the Gospel, profess faith in Jesus and the Catholic Church, and receive the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and Holy Eucharist. The RCIA process follows the ancient practice of the Church and was restored by the Second Vatican Council as the normal way adults prepare for baptism. In 1974 the Rite for Christian Initiation for Adults was formally approved for use in the United States" (www.usccb.org). The RCIA also is for adults baptized in other Christian traditions who wish to receive the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist in the Catholic Church and for adults who were baptized in the Catholic Church and wish to complete their initiation. Por eso, tras un día agotador y de tensiones del trabajo o la familia, es preciso reposar, relajarse y distraer la mente en cosas alegres, apacibles y positivas.

El Señor nos ofrece un descanso que nos renueva espiritualmente y restituye en nosotros la capacidad de disfrutar de la paz, el gozo y la libertad. ¿Cómo podemos lograr este descanso? Recibiendo lo que Dios tanto desea darnos: el perdón, la vida misma y la dicha de conocer su gran amor. El Señor nos bendice de esta forma cuando nos acercamos a él en la oración y en la liturgia y cuando ponemos nuestras cargas en sus tiernas y poderosas manos.

Sin embargo, para abrir el corazón de esta forma hay que ser humilde y aceptar la acción renovadora del Señor. El que vive dominado por los impulsos de su naturaleza pecadora, es decir, oponiéndose a la voluntad de Dios y desentendiéndose de la necesidad del prójimo, no puede experimentar el descanso que Cristo quiere darle.

LECTURAS DEL 13 DE JULIO

uando el Señor pronunció la parábola del sembrador, se valió de figuras conocidas para la comunidad de labradores y pastores que le escuchaba. Jesús les habló del poder de la Palabra de Dios y del llamado que el Señor hace a todo el que quiera abrir el corazón al amor del Padre. El Señor ama tanto a su creación que esparce la semilla de su Palabra a los cuatro vientos, dejándola caer en todo tipo de terreno. No reservó su valiosísima semilla solo para la tierra buena o los de corazón puro, sino que la esparció generosamente sobre todo tipo de corazones, incluso los pedregosos y llenos de espinas. La Palabra de Dios es poderosa y no regresa a él sin haber cumplido el propósito para el cual fue pronunciada (Isaías 55, 10-11). Incluso donde el terreno distaba mucho de ser ideal, el trigo creció y produjo una cosecha.

Cuando pensamos en el poder vivificante de la Palabra de Dios y en el Espíritu que la hace germinar, se nos ocurre preguntarnos: "¿Qué tipo de terreno soy yo? ¿Echa raíces profundas en mí la Palabra de Dios? ¿Aprovecho las oportunidades que Dios me da para que esa palabra crezca?" Por eso, cuando nos encontremos con alguien a quien nos cuesta amar, clamemos al Señor: "¡Señor, ablanda el terreno de mi corazón y hazlo fecundo!"

Cuando te asalten pensamientos de amargura, cólera o desconsuelo, pídele a Dios que te dé el poder de superarlos: "¡Señor, ablanda mi corazón!" Cristo nos invita cada día, con sencillez, a entregarnos en sus manos y pedirle que su Espíritu Santo haga más dócil nuestro corazón. Pero no permitas que el fracaso te desaliente, porque si hasta la creación "misma va a ser liberada de la esclavitud de la corrupción" (v. Romanos 8, 21), ¡cuánto más los hijos tendremos la oportunidad de acercarnos a Dios y recibir su gracia!

CHILDREN'S RELIGIOUS EDUCATION -- ST. MATTHEW'S CATHEDRAL -- 2014-2015



The Religious Education program at St. Matthew's Cathedral exists to provide sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation as well as ongoing faith formation for children who have received these sacraments. It strives to communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ in the context of the beliefs and practices of the Roman Catholic Church. The program presents the four fundamental themes of the Catechism of the Catholic Church – Creed, Sacraments, Morality, and Prayer – in such a way that the children of our parish begin to understand how to live the Gospel.

When and where are classes held?

Classes are held weekly on Sunday mornings from 9:45 to 11am in the St. Matthew's Education Center located at 1726 N Street NW. It is expected that parents will attend a special class for them at the same time and that families will worship at either the 8:30am Mass before class or the 11:30am Mass following class. Classes generally are not held on holiday weekends.

When do classes begin?

There will be a mandatory parent-teacher meeting Sunday, September 7, 2014 from 9:45 to 11am in the North Conference Room. Classes will begin Sunday, September 14, 2014 and conclude in late May 2015.

How do I register my child(ren)?

Complete the two-sided registration form (available at the Cathedral entrance, in the rectory, and on the parish website), and attach your child's Baptism certificate (if new to the Religious Education program) and cash or check made payable to St. Matthew's Cathedral for \$50.00 per family. Financial assistance and/or a payment plan are available for those in need. Submit registration materials to the Director of Faith Formation in the Cathedral Rectory.


