# THE JOY OF LOVE (*AMORIS LAETITIA*)

## Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation of Pope Francis

### THEMES AND SCHEDULE:

#### Love that lasts an eternity

**Tuesday, October 3 from 7-8pm**

Love begins with God and we learn how to love in the example of the communion of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The study of *Amoris Laetitia* begins in the exploration of the meaning of love that is grounded in communion, self-giving and fidelity. (*Amoris Laetitia*, paragraphs 1-7, 67-70, 90)

#### Freedom for love as freedom to love

**Tuesday, October 17 from 7-8pm**

Our faith teaches that family is a “school of love.” In *Amoris Laetitia* we learn that real love begins in the freedom to love and be loved. Join us in exploring the characteristics that describe the kind of love that makes marriage and family life a reflection of God’s love. (*Amoris Laetitia*, paragraphs 58-85, 90-119, 319-320)

#### A Church that loves: The practice of accompaniment toward a deeper love for Jesus

**Tuesday, November 7 from 7-8pm**

Pope Francis writes that “only in contemplating Christ can a person come to know the deepest truth about human relationships.” In *Amoris Laetitia*, we reflect on some of the “hard teachings” of Christian love in a secular age. (*Amoris Laetitia*, paragraphs 143-164, 291-312)
