SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION FOR ADULTS AND CHILDREN

Adult Confirmation Preparation

Each spring during the Easter season, St. Matthew's offers *adult Confirmation preparation* for active, baptized Catholics who already have received their First Eucharist. Preparation includes four Thursday evenings (*April 11, 18, 25 & May 2*) and one Saturday (*May 4*). The celebration of adult Confirmation in 2013 will occur at a special Mass on Ascension Sunday, *May 12*. Registration forms will be available in the Cathedral rectory and on the parish website beginning the weekend of *February 2 & 3*. The deadline to register is Friday, *March 15*.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

Please pray for the women and men of our RCIA as they prepare to receive the Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist – at the Easter Vigil. They will celebrate these important rites in the coming months:

Sun. February 10 – Rite of Sending (5:30pm Mass)

Sun. February 17 – Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion (3pm, Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception)

Sun. February 24 – Penitential Rite for Baptized Candidates (5:30pm Mass)

Suns. March 3, 10 & 17 – Scrutinies for the Unbaptized Elect (5:30pm Mass)

Wed. March 6 – Presentation of the Creed to the Unbaptized Elect (5:30pm Mass)

Wed. March 13 – First Penance for Baptized Candidates

Wed. March 20 – Presentation of the Lord's Prayer to the Unbaptized Elect (5:30pm Mass)

For adults interested in learning more about the Catholic faith and/or becoming Catholic, Inquiry meets on the second Wednesday of each month (September through May) from 6:30 to 7:30pm in the East Conference Room. A brief overview of the entire adult initiation process – RCIA – can be presented after Inquiry for those who are interested.

St. Matthew's also offers sacramental preparation and ongoing religious education for school-age children.
