My dear friends,

As I sit here at my desk, I'm hearing reports on the radio of more snow—not much, just enough to cover the grass. This time last week, I was in Florida enjoying warmer weather and good friends. Looking ahead, we are reminded that Lent is almost here! Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, is celebrated this year on March 5. The Lenten season is filled with many challenges and opportunities. The greatest of these is not to turn it into solely an individual journey, but to recognize it as a journey that we share with our faith family, the Church. Lent is for the Church, the people of God, and as such, we journey as one.

As we start our Lenten journey, this year I would like to share a brief reflection from Pope Francis.

One of the greatest dangers lying in wait for us is "getting used to it." We become so used to life and to everything in it that nothing surprises us—neither the good, to give thanks, nor the evil, to truly sadden us. I am surprised and perplexed when I ask an acquaintance how he is, and he replies: "Bad, but I'm used to it."

We get used to getting up each day as if there were no other way of seeing things. We get used to violence as something that's unavoidable. We get used to poverty and misery habitually walking through the streets of our city. We get used to seeing women and children at night in the inner city carrying away the castoffs of others. We get used to living in a paganized city where children do not know how to pray or make the Sign of the Cross.

Getting used to things anesthetizes the heart, destroying the capacity for that amazement that renews us in hope. We are left with no room for the recognition of evil and the power to struggle against it.

On the other hand, there are moments so powerful that they shock us out of this unhealthy perspective and reveal a reality that challenges us a little more each time. For example, when we lose some very beloved person or thing, we tend to value and be thankful for what we have—what, a moment earlier, we hadn't really appreciated. Along our journey as disciples, Lent presents that powerful moment, that turning point that brings our hearts out of the routine and laziness of habit.

Lenten Liturgies at the Cathedral

Lent is a special time in the life of a parish. There is no better way to heed the clarion call of Lent than to join the Church in the celebration of the liturgies. The prayers and readings—the Liturgy of the Word—and the Liturgy of the Eucharist will give us the strength and the guidance to make the journey through the desert to the empty tomb of promise, to rise with Christ on Easter Sunday after having been plunged into his death at our Baptism. If we make the journey with integrity, then we will arrive at the tomb and see the future, and, indeed, share in his resurrection.

Once again this Lenten season, the Cathedral will offer ample opportunities to prepare for the great Feast of the Resurrection of the Lord. Enclosed is our Lenten brochure, which I urge you to keep close at hand in the weeks ahead. And don't be shy about picking up an extra copy or two for your family, friends and co-workers.

On Ash Wednesday, *March 5*, we will wear the sign of penitence as a reminder of the need for our inner conversion, for the rending of our hearts, not our garments, and for our return to the Lord our God. (*Joel 2:13*). On Sunday, *March 9*, our catechumens and candidates will travel to the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception to participate with Cardinal Wuerl in the Rite of Election. Please keep these men and women in your prayers.

The Stations of the Cross, in the form adopted by Pope John Paul II, will be celebrated in English on the Fridays of Lent at 6pm and in Spanish on Sundays at 2:15pm. The Stations of the Cross, or Via Crucis, is a journey made in the Holy Spirit, the divine fire that burned in the heart of Jesus and brought him to Calvary. I urge you to take advantage of this beautiful devotion, which is particularly fitting for Lent.

Each Wednesday of Lent beginning on *March 12*, priests will be available for confessions in both English and Spanish from 6:30pm until 8pm (and from 6:15pm to 7:15pm on Wednesday of Holy Week). We will continue our regularly scheduled confessions on weekdays, 11am to Noon and on Saturdays, 4pm to 5pm. On Tuesday, *April 15*, we will hold a Communal Penance Service at 12:10pm with at least 15 priests available for individual confessions.

Lenten Faith Formation Offerings

Join us for "Reconciled: Salesian Perspectives on Mercy, Humility, and Forgiveness," our annual Lenten Morning of Recollection, on Saturday, *March 8*. Our Advent Day of Recollection presenter this past December, Oblate of St. Francis de Sales Father Michael Murray, will return to lead us in prayer and reflection. An excellent way to begin your Lenten journey, this morning retreat will begin at 9am in the North Conference Room and will conclude with our 12:10pm Mass. All are welcome. "Encountering Jesus": St. Matthew's Lenten Lecture Series will highlight ways in which we can strive to draw closer to Jesus Christ in our everyday lives and share the power of those encounters with others. The four-part series will include the following talks: "Where Do We Meet Jesus?" (Monsignor Peter J. Vaghi), "Encountering Jesus in the Word" (Sister Patricia A. Parachini, SNJM), "Encountering Jesus in the Sacraments" (Father Raymond B. Kemp), and "Encountering Jesus in Works of Charity" (Father James J. Greenfield, OSFS). The series begins on Thursday, *March* 13 and continues every following Wednesday and Thursday through the first week in April in the North Conference Room. Wednesday lectures will be given from 12:45pm to 1:45pm, and Thursday lectures will be given from 7pm to 8pm. All are welcome at any or all lectures. No registration is required.

Father Jack Hurley will continue his **Bible study on the Gospel of John** on Saturdays, *March 15 and 22 and April 5* from 10:30 to 11:45am in the East Conference Room. All are welcome as we study the Last Supper, the Passion, and the Resurrection. No registration is required.

Did you know that, during the Easter season, St. Matthew's offers a preparation program for active adult Catholics who have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation? We invite all baptized adult Catholics who have received First Eucharist but not Confirmation to take advantage of this great opportunity! Sessions will be held on Thursdays, *May 1, 8, 15, and 22* from 7pm to 9pm with a retreat on Saturday, *May 17*. We will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation on Ascension Sunday, *June 1*. Registration forms are available in the Cathedral rectory and on the parish website. Please register no later than Friday, *April 4*. (This preparation is only for those baptized Catholics who have already celebrated their First Eucharist. For others, please contact Heather Kinney to discuss participation in the RCIA process.)


