STATIONS OF THE CROSS (VIA CRUCIS)

The *Via Crucis* is a journey made in the Holy Spirit, the divine fire that burned in the heart of Jesus and brought him to Calvary. The Stations are prayed in English throughout Lent on Fridays at 6PM and in Spanish on Sundays at 2:15PM, and on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday at the times listed.
