#### The Community Safety and Health Amendment Act of 2019 B23-0318

would fully decriminalize the sex trade, including acts of pimping, purchasing sex, and operating brothels in Washington, D.C.

The measure not only threatens the well-being of vulnerable women and children throughout the DMV area, but will also greatly exacerbate sex trafficking.

## **MYTH:**

Full decriminalization will stop sex trafficking and improve safety.

### FACT:

- During the 29 year period of full decrim in Rhode Island, out-of-state traffickers brought victims to RI to take advantage of the lack of laws and regulation.
- Underage teens were exploited in the sex industry in RI under full decrim.
- Child sex trafficking was not reduced by full decrim in New Zealand.
- Most women in NZ's sex trade do not feel safer/experience less violence today under full decrim.

In a sample of 100 prostituted women in D.C.:

met the criteria for Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

reported being

physically assaulted.

**80%** reported being threatened with a weapon.

had been raped in prostitution, with

of these rapes committed by sex buyers.
