

Readings for November 10

He is not God of the dead, but of the living. (*Luke 20:38*) It's clear that the Sadducees were trying to trip up Jesus when they presented the hypothetical situation of a woman who was married to seven brothers over her lifetime. The Sadducees were an influential group who thought that their strict adherence to the first five books of the Bible (the Law of Moses) left no room for belief in the resurrection of the dead. They thought that presenting such a scenario to Jesus would stump him—and give them reason to accuse him of blasphemy.

But Jesus turned their question around and used it to affirm the promise of the resurrection. Those "deemed worthy . . . to the resurrection of the dead" won't be married in heaven, he told them. They will be like the angels—immortal (*Luke 20:35, 36*). Quoting from the Law of Moses, he said that God would not call himself the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob unless these patriarchs were also living (*Exodus 3:6*). He is God of the living, "for to him all are alive" (*Luke 20:38*).

This is indeed good news! Even though we will all one day experience physical death, we will still be alive to God. How could we not be? At our baptism, the immortal and eternal God came to live in us. When we are striving to live our faith, not even death can separate us from God. Someday, when Jesus comes again, he will raise our bodies to new life as well.

The more we hold fast to these truths, the less we will fear death. Rather than looking at it as an ending, we will view it more as a passageway into a new and better life. This doesn't mean that we won't feel some apprehension or anxiety about dying. After all, we really don't know what heaven will be like. But we can choose to trust in God's promises. We can believe that if we follow the Lord today, our tomorrow will be brighter than we can possibly imagine.

On Saturday **December 14**, Fr. Hurley presents a single session on the Prologue to the Gospel of John, once considered the Second Gospel and read at the end of every Mass. This remains one of the special Christmas Day readings, profound but often overlooked that day.

Cathedral Book Club – Join the Book Club discussion of "Living Buddha, Living Christ," by Thich Nhat Hanh on Monday, **November 18**, 6:45 - 8pm in the East Conference Room. Thich Nhat Hanh is perhaps the most well-known Buddhist teacher in the West. This

Vietnamese monk is described as "a rare combination of mystic, scholar and activist." He was nominated by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. for the Nobel Peace Prize. The book is described as "lucid and meditative prose" in which the author explores the compassion and holiness at which Christianity and Buddhism meet. His reflection on mindfulness presents a poetic and readable recommendation for our time.



Lecturas del 10 de Noviembre

Dios no es Dios de muertos, sino de vivos, pues para él todos viven. (Lucas 20, 38)

Los saduceos no creían en la resurrección de los muertos. Por eso, le preguntaron a Jesús de quién sería esposa "en la resurrección", una mujer que hubiera tenido siete maridos los cuales hubieran muerto sin dejar descendencia. Querían saber si el Señor tomaba partido con ellos o con los fariseos, sus rivales. Pero la respuesta del Señor los dejó callados: la vida en "este mundo" es muy diferente de la vida en el "otro mundo", donde no habrá matrimonio.

Gracias a Jesús, los cristianos somos "hijos de Dios por haber resucitado" (Lucas 20, 36), pero esto no significa que debamos desentendernos de las cosas de "este mundo"; por el contrario, significa que el punto de vista con que veamos esta vida debe coincidir con la nueva condición espiritual que tenemos en Cristo. En Jesús podemos tener comunión con Dios y conocer los designios del Padre, experimentar su amor y ser cada vez más capaces de actuar según su voluntad.

El Señor desea enseñarnos a ver la vida con los ojos de la eternidad y formar nuestros pensamientos y acciones según el destino final que tendremos, pero ¿cómo podemos hacer esto si nunca maduramos más allá de un entendimiento limitado y terrenal de la herencia que nos corresponde como hijos de Dios?

Todos enfrentamos dilemas y tenemos que saber, por ejemplo, cómo vamos a pagar las cuentas o educar a nuestros hijos, cómo vamos a resolver una dificultad grave en el trabajo y cosas por el estilo. Cualesquiera sean nuestros problemas, podemos estar seguros de que el Espíritu Santo nos ayudará a ver cada situación con los ojos de la fe, y así veremos que posiblemente Dios nos manifieste su amor a través del sufrimiento, o utilizarnos como instrumentos suyos para la sanación y liberación de otras personas. Trata de ver todo con la perspectiva de Dios y así verás que hasta los grandes problemas son oportunidades para recibir la vida de la eternidad.
