My dear parishioners,

Lent is almost here! It begins on Ash Wednesday, **March 2**. As we were preparing for Lent last year, the dangers of COVID-19 were steadily coming into focus. It was a very difficult year. We now have the omicron variant, though it seems to be subsiding. Still, we are unsettled and uncertain.

Many offices remain closed. Employees are working remotely from their homes.

Schools are in a state of confusion - masks or no masks, required or optional?

If we go out for dinner, do we need to present our vaccination card?

And Mass attendance - where are our parishioners? Still worried, not sure it is safe to return to Sunday worship?

When will all this end? Once again, Lent offers us hope—a time to give thanks to God for his love, comfort, and mercy, knowing as we do that, as uncertainty continues, so does God's sacrificial love for us.

We Need Lent

As Christians we believe that **Jesus shared his life with us**; he is our friend, brother, and companion. This is the hope that awakens us each day. This is the power that spurs us on with enthusiasm. This is our hope: to live in light, in the light of Jesus.

We need Lent this year more than ever.

We are still **challenged as a nation**. In our deeply divided country there is a great need for civility, dialogue, and peaceful expression of concerns. Respect for one another and a willingness to dialogue and learn from one another are essential. There is no other way if we are to be **faithful to the Gospel of Jesus Christ**.

We are **challenged as Catholics**. Mass attendance is down, and for those who are able to attend—masks and sanitizing for all present, and no drinking from the cup. These months have been rough. How do we continue as Church? We wait, pray, and hope. But we still question. **Where is Jesus in all of this**?

We need a renewed personal encounter with Jesus, who IS here, next to us, reaching out to us with open arms. Jesus is our only real hope. We look to the future, with Jesus, working together towards a renewed Church right here in our midst, guided by His Holy Spirit. If you haven't participated in one of the Synod listening sessions at St. Matthew's yet, please come to the Great Hall for our final February session on Sunday, February 27 at 6:30pm (in English) and join in the Church's heart-to-heart conversation and dialogue as we discern the Spirit's call before beginning this Lenten season.

We Also Need One Another's Support

Our challenges also are financial. In the fall of 2020 I wrote to you about the significant decline in financial contributions due to the pandemic. We had taken advantage of the PPP loan, restructured positions, hours, and salaries. Needing hope? You bet!! As your rector I kept looking for it.

Thank God for FaithDirect And then, Jesus brought us **Advent/Christmas hope fulfilled** – oh, how sweet it was! Parishioners and Friends responded, delivering the needed support for our parish ministries and programs, and the running of the rectory office.

Christmas 2021, however, did not bring as bright a story, as these income statistics show:

We are facing the prospect of an overall budget shortfall and the consequences; yet, I have faith. I believe in you. I know you will respond to the need. Jesus is the world's ultimate hope, and **we are his hands and feet** in our homes and workplaces, and in the public square. **Sustained giving is key to the survival** of our parish ministries and programs, and of the infrastructure that makes these possible. Close to home for us at St. Matthew's, our forecasted expenses include the cost of several repairs that cannot be postponed another year, including repairs to our gutter system, and to the Cathedral dome and front steps.

We are all called to commit to **good stewardship**, giving generously from what we have, recognizing that in the end, **all is gift**, **all is grace**. Are you among the two-thirds of parishioners who have not given a recognizable gift to the parish? If so, I ask – **will you please begin to give** something from what you have? We need ALL our members. I am so grateful and sincerely appreciate and continue to count on your support.

Lenten Liturgies

There is no better way to heed the clarion call of Lent than to join the Church in the celebration of the liturgies. The prayers and readings—the Liturgy of the Word—and the Liturgy of the Eucharist give us the strength and guidance to journey through the desert to the empty tomb of promise, to rise with Christ on Easter Sunday after having been plunged into his death at our Baptism. If we journey with integrity, then we will arrive at the tomb and see the future, and, indeed, **share in his resurrection**.

On Ash Wednesday, March 2 we are reminded of the need for our inner conversion, for the rending of our hearts, not our garments, and for our return to the Lord our God. (Joel 2:13) Masses with the distribution of ashes will be celebrated at 7:30am, 11am, 12:10pm (Cardinal Gregory), 5:30pm, and 7pm (Spanish).

We hope you will take part in many of the prayer, devotional, faith formation, social justice, and music events, many of which will be livestreamed.
