hours that Fr. John and I spend each week with engaged couples are so rewarding - we love it! And even after 24 years at St. Matthew's, baptism requests and surprise visits from 'my couples,' often with children in tow, are still a delight. Be assured that our sacramentally and spiritually vibrant parish adds so much to your priests' lives!

### **Financial Health**

Our financial picture, unfortunately, is not as vibrant, though with God all things are possible!

To summarize from the **Collections chart** below, **our major income sources this past year were consistently down from the previous year** - the weekly offertory, the monthly second collection for Cathedral maintenance, Christmas and Easter collections, and our Christmas Friends of the Cathedral appeal.

While **the past year's income declined, expenses went up**, particularly amounts due the Archdiocese. In response we enacted substantial expense cuts to balance the budget, and ended the year with a small surplus (1.3% of actual expenses). See the **Income and Expenses chart** above, which lists the past year's figures from the **2018-2019 financial statement** recently approved by the Finance Council.

The declines in the offertory collection and other income sources are continuing. The Finance Council and the Parish Council's Stewardship Committee have been tasked with addressing the income decline. Without a reversal of the downward trend, we will run a large deficit this year. The Finance Council recently approved our **2019-2020 budget**, which totals \$2,733,992, reflecting a **projected deficit of \$91,563**. Note that these figures emerged after several rounds of additional expense cuts during the 2019-2020 budget process.

## Participation in the Abundance of God

While the Finance Council and Stewardship Committee take up their work, a reminder - just as grace is a participation in the life of God, so stewardship is a participation *by all of us* in His abundance. **Just as we receive from God's abundance, so we must give from it.** 

Here's a fact: **over the course of a year, only one-third of our parishioners give an identifiable offertory gift**. If the rest of our households would give even \$5 weekly, we could erase our deficit. I ask you - please assess what you can afford to give and **enroll in Faith Direct**, our e-giving program. Currently, 795 parishioners already give through Faith Direct. Thank you for considering the use of this lifeline between you and the body of our parish community!
